# FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

This is an exciting weekend for us at Carmel Mission, as we begin a limited re-opening for the celebration of Mass with two Masses on Sunday at 7:30am and 11am. We also continue our streaming Mass for those who are unable to join us here at the Mission. While we are happy to be able to welcome you back to your Basilica, we remain acutely aware that the threat of Coronavirus is far from over. We are taking every measure possible to keep you safe, whether you choose to come to the Mission or continue to worship with us online via our streaming Mass. Whichever you choose, I am thankful for the continued opportunity to pray together.

Also, a very Happy Father's Day to all fathers! The love of our fathers is a reflection of the love of our Heavenly Father, and we are grateful to all are called to fatherhood in its many forms.

As we begin our journey in Ordinary Time, Jesus has a clear message for us in the Gospel, "Fear no one, do not be afraid." We look at the world today and we see much fear, and perhaps much to fear. The Coronavirus has taken over 490,000 lives around the world, and threatens economic as well as physical health. We are confronted with the terrible reality of racial inequality in our country. We are indeed afraid.

But Jesus says "Do not be afraid" in the face of all the fearsome world has to offer. Not because there is no cause for fear, and not because He does not know fear. We know He experienced fear Himself, in the Garden of Gethsemane. But in the garden He turned His fear over to God, "Not my will, but yours be done." (Luke 22:42) His trust in the Father was greater than any fear. This is our example; when our faith is greater than our fear, we are not ruled by it, we can overcome it. We are all in God's hands, and we know how precious we are to Him. He has counted every hair on our heads, He has known us since before He formed us in the womb. (Jeremiah 1:5). As we gather for worship this weekend, here at the Mission and online, I invite you examine your own fears, understand them, acknowledge them, and then turn them over to the God who loves us beyond our comprehension. When we can let go of our fears, we can grow, we can change, and we can better live out our mission to be the Body of Christ.

I thank you for your continued support of Carmel Mission, which allows us to serve you, our beloved, community in the varied ways needed at this time. And I wish you and your loved ones continued blessings of good health, true peace, and the profound love of our Heavenly Father,

## Scripture Message

In the Gospel today Jesus encourages the disciples to be fearless in their ministry. He wants them to proclaim their faith "from the rooftops" and to "fear no one." This is possible, even in the face of what may befall them at the hands of those who are not ready to hear their message, because of the unfathomably great love and care of the Father. The Father knows the hairs on each of our heads, and He tracks every breath, even of the sparrows. Nothing is too small for His concern and His attention. In the first reading, Jeremiah shows us it is not always easy to be a prophet of God, especially when the intended audience of the prophecy plan to eliminate the message by eliminating the messenger. Jeremiah entrusts his cause to the Lord, and thus fears nothing, as he knows the Lord will rescue his life. Being fearless as Jesus asks does not mean that we will never know fear. We know that Jesus Himself experienced fear in the Garden of Gethsemane, but it never deterred Him from what He knew He must do. He was fearless not because of a lack of understandable fear, but because His faith and trust in the Father was so much greater. We may never be asked to sacrifice our lives as Jesus did, but we are encouraged to exhibit the same fearlessness rooted in faith. We may need to confront and overcome our own prejudices and bias, to die to them so that the spirit of Christ may rise up within us. Knowing how much we are loved and valued by God, we are called to share this wonderful truth with all, that "The Lord hears the poor, and his own who are in bonds, he spurns not."

Each year at this time, parishes throughout the Diocese of Monterey are launching the Annual Ministries Appeal. By our participation in this appeal, we assist so many people to grow in faith.

In this AMA campaign letter we will provide you with some idea of the huge variety of diocesan ministries that benefit as a result of your generous support of this appeal.

Since I was appointed Pastor at our beautiful Mission, your support has seen us go from strength to strength. Last year, our Renew A Pew Campaign had more donors contribute than any other parish in our diocese. We also raised the largest amount and were able to renew our pews for the next generation. The first \$50,000.00 raised goes to our diocese and any sum over that amount comes back to our Mission.

# CALIFORNIA'S SANCTUARY OF LIGHT

The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. (John 1:5)

Between the years of 1793 and 1797, the Old Stone Basilica Church of the Carmel Mission was designed and constructed by Manuel Ruiz and his brother, master mason Santiago Ruiz of San Blas, Mexico. They built our missionary church according to mandated construction practices of the era that were formed to express liturgical meaning throughout the sacred space of the Mission Church.

The iconic Star of Bethlehem window and the façade of the old church reflect this liturgical expression in that they are orientated in such a way that it creates a stunning solar alignment to the Mission Basilica Church every year. In the weeks before and after the period anchored to the summer solstice, a wondrous illumination of the Mission sanctuary can be witnessed.

In these many days, weather permitting, the morning sunlight processes over the hills of Jack's Peak and floods the church's window and doorway with concentrated sunlight.

This unique architectural display and use of natural light was a mandated liturgical practice, as seen in the writings of Saint Charles Borromeo's the patron saint of the Carmel Mission. Older Churches throughout the world, here in California and as far away as the Philippines have similar illuminations that can be witnessed differing times of the year depending on the orientation of those churches.



The understanding of how to create this amazing display of light has been practiced since ancient times throughout the world. The Carmel Mission Basilica was constructed to be oriented on a 60-degree azimuth (East North East). This puts the alignment of the church in sync with the sun when it is at its greatest distance north from the celestial equator and marks the longest day of the year in our region of the world. This year the date of the summer solstice is Saturday, June 20.

The Illuminations of the Mission sanctuary create a deeper liturgical meaning when we consider the feast days following the Easter season. This includes the Ascension of Christ, Pentecost, and Corpus Christi. Additionally, we know from tradition and historical writings of the Mission Franciscan Friars, that the statue image of Our Lady of Bethlehem with Christ as a child was originally centered in the sanctuary above the altar and tabernacle — signifying the birth of Christ and Mary's importance to the Faith. Witnessed from this perspective the illumination of Mission sanctuary, through the mediums of art and architecture, perfectly illuminates the life, ministry, resurrection, and salvation offered by the Light of Christ.

Tap on the Options icon (three dots) at the top right corner of the screen




Tap on "Add to Home Screen"
