## FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

In Sunday's Gospel Jesus tells us, "To anyone who has, more is given." We can well imagine this phrase with the word "faith" included; to anyone who has faith, more faith is given. We are relying on faith more than ever in these difficult and uncertain times. As we contemplate the state of the world, it would be easy to overlook the hand of God, but we know, by faith, that we are all in God's hand. The more we trust and have faith in God, the more that faith is returned with the peace of Christ that passes all understanding in our hearts.

Another phrase that comes to mind at the moment is, "there is nothing so constant as change". Indeed, we have experienced yet another change in our re-opening efforts here at Carmel Mission this week. Monterey County, in response to growing numbers of Coronavirus cases in our area, has re-imposed some restrictions. As such, we have had to temporarily close the Basilica and much of the Mission grounds to visitors. The Mission store remains open, and we are able to open the Basilica for Masses only at this time. Sacrament of Reconciliation will continue this Saturday, but in a new location, our Central Courtyard. As always, I encourage you to visit the Advisory Page on our website for all the latest information on these changes. Thank you for your continued support and flexibility as we navigate the ever-changing demands of protecting the health and well-being of our community.

Last week, we live streamed our 11am Mass for the first time. It was wonderful to have over 500 people join us online for this celebration. Our connections as community of faith continue to evolve and develop. Thank for you being part of our family here at Carmel Mission, we are so appreciative of your presence and your support.

Jesus tells his disciples, "blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear." We are indeed blessed, especially in this perilous time, to have the vision of our Savior always before us, and to hear His voice. Jesus reminds us several times in the Gospel that we need to listen. Listen, not only to Him, but to our brothers and sisters as well. Sometimes the greatest gift we can give someone to is take the time to truly listen to them. This week, I invite you to join me in the act of listening. When we make the space within to listen to God and to one another, we equip ourselves to become the listening ears and the helping hands of Christ in our world.

#### **Reopening Requirements and Logistics**

Presently, we are limited to utilizing only 25% of our seating capacity and not to exceed more than 100 persons on the property. We will be operating on a first come, first served basis with no access to the property until 30 minutes before Mass.

By necessity, we are required to rely upon a limited number of staff to implement the safety protocols and support for our masses. This will not be an easy task for them, and we ask for your patience and cooperation as we work diligently to welcome you back.

### **Guidelines for Attending Mass**

The safety of our parishioners, staff, and celebrants is critically important as we come together. Per Diocesan guidelines Parishioners who are medically vulnerable or over the age of 65 should remain at home for now.

**Parking:** Parking for Sunday Masses will be available in the school lot. Access to the Mission will only be available through the JSS lot gate.

Parking for Daily Masses will be in the front parking lot. Access to the Mission will be through the front gates.

**Singing:** All singing and chanting is prohibited in houses of worship at this time.

**Financial stewardship:** We will be taking up a collection at the 7:30 AM and 11:00 AM Masses on Sundays. Electronic giving through <u>carmelmission.org</u> remains a preferred option, but also feel free to bring your weekly offering to Sunday Mass.

**Volunteers:** Volunteers are needed to help as monitors and ushers for our Sunday Masses. If you wish to volunteer please email Laura at <a href="mailto:liturgy@carmelmission.org">liturgy@carmelmission.org</a>. Access to the Sanctuary and Sacristy remains restricted to Staff only.

**Restrooms:** Restrooms are not available at this time.

### **Scripture Message**

In the Gospel today Jesus teaches the crowd using the parable of the seed and the sower. The sower tosses the seed out to an indeterminate fate, depending on where it lands, it may be eaten or fail to thrive. The seed that lands on good fertile soil will grow and thrive, and help to support other lives with its bounty. Jesus goes on to explain the parable, that the seed is the word of God. The different scenarios is how that word is received into our hearts. We can be fertile soil by hearing the word and striving to understand, and allowing that understanding to shape our lives. Jesus says, "Whoever has ears ought to hear." The word of God is for all who have ears, but it is our responsibility to truly listen. Jesus also tells his disciples, "Blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear." To see and to hear God is a great privilege. We are called to invite others to listen as well, to prepare the fertile soil that will receive the word and grow and thrive. In all of life's relationships, listening is a crucial skill. In our well-meaning hope to help our brothers and sisters, we may overlook the important step of taking time to listen to them. To see them and to hear them. To hear and to try to understand where they are and where they are coming from. So too, in our life of prayer, in our exuberance to talk to our loving God, we may forget to also listen for His voice. Jesus reminds us today that being able hear the "word of the Kingdom," and receive it into our own hearts is an important part of being the seeing eyes, the hearing ears and the loving hands of Christ in our world.

# Annual Ministry Appeal 2020 Heavenly Sounds

I hope that you and your loved ones are well.

Each year at this time, parishes throughout the Diocese of Monterey are launching the Annual Ministries Appeal. By our participation in this appeal, we assist so many people to grow in faith.

In this AMA campaign letter we will provide you with some idea of the huge variety of diocesan ministries that benefit as a result of your generous support of this appeal.

Since I was appointed Pastor at our beautiful Mission, your support has seen us go from strength to strength. Last year, our Renew A Pew Campaign had more donors contribute than any other parish in our diocese. We also raised the largest amount and were able to renew our pews for the next generation. I hope that you find them comfortable.

The first \$50,000.00 raised goes to our diocese and any sum over that amount comes back to our Mission.

This year our parish campaign is called: Heavenly Sounds, and has as its objective, the enhancement of the sound in our Basilica.

We probably have the best music in the Diocese of Monterey. Our wonderful Choir, Cantors, and musicians add so much to our liturgies and help us raise our minds and hearts to God. We also have music events throughout the year, the Bach Festival being a prime example. It is our intention to develop our music ministry and to add to our musical calendar.

A major component of our music at the Mission is our wonderful Casavant organ. This beautiful instrument adds so much to our many liturgies. The time has come when our Casavant organ requires immediate attention, if we are to continue to use it. A portion of our Heavenly Sounds Campaign will be used to replace all the electrical and computer components, which are totally out of date. We will be providing you with more detailed information soon.

I know that once again I can rely on your generous support, so that we at Carmel Mission can continue to create those Heavenly Sounds.

She gave him the scapular with the following words, which are preserved in a fourteenth century narrative: "This will be for you and for all Carmelites the privilege, that he who dies in this will not suffer eternal fire."


The planning for the 250th Anniversary of our Mission's founding, a significant event for our community and the history of California, has begun.

# CALIFORNIA'S SANCTUARY OF LIGHT

The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. (John 1:5)

Between the years of 1793 and 1797, the Old Stone Basilica Church of the Carmel Mission was designed and constructed by Manuel Ruiz and his brother, master mason Santiago Ruiz of San Blas, Mexico. They built our missionary church according to mandated construction practices of the era that were formed to express liturgical meaning throughout the sacred space of the Mission Church.

The iconic Star of Bethlehem window and the façade of the old church reflect this liturgical expression in that they are orientated in such a way that it creates a stunning solar alignment to the Mission Basilica Church every year. In the weeks before and after the period anchored to the summer solstice, a wondrous illumination of the Mission sanctuary can be witnessed. In these many days, weather permitting, the morning sunlight processes over the hills of Jack's Peak and floods the church's window and doorway with concentrated sunlight.

This unique architectural display and use of natural light was a mandated liturgical practice, as seen in the writings of Saint Charles Borromeo's the patron saint of the Carmel Mission. Older Churches throughout the world, here in California and as far away as the Philippines have similar illuminations that can be witnessed differing times of the year depending on the orientation of those churches.





The understanding of how to create this amazing display of light has been practiced since ancient times throughout the world. The Carmel Mission Basilica was constructed to be oriented on a 60-degree azimuth (East North East). This puts the alignment of the church in sync with the sun when it is at its greatest distance north from the celestial equator and marks the longest day of the year in our region of the world. This year the date of the summer solstice is Saturday, June 20.

The Illuminations of the Mission sanctuary create a deeper liturgical meaning when we consider the feast days following the Easter season. This includes the Ascension of Christ, Pentecost, and Corpus Christi. Additionally, we know from tradition and historical writings of the Mission Franciscan Friars, that the statue image of Our Lady of Bethlehem with Christ as a child was originally centered in the sanctuary above the altar and tabernacle — signifying the birth of Christ and Mary's importance to the Faith. Witnessed from this perspective the illumination of Mission sanctuary, through the mediums of art and architecture, perfectly illuminates the life, ministry, resurrection, and salvation offered by the Light of Christ.
