"Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar
and to God what belongs to God."

— Matthew 22:21

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Today we hear a familiar story from Scripture in our Gospel passage. "Repay to Cesar what belongs to Cesar and to God what belongs to God." In Jesus' artful answer to what the Pharisees had hoped would be an impossible question is a beautiful truth. Jesus asks for the Roman coin to show that it bears the likeness of Cesar and thus can and should be returned to Cesar. If we follow that logic in determining what is to be repaid to God, we must ask, what bears God's image? The answer, of course, is you and me and every human person.

Please take a moment to reflect on the awesome fact that we are made in the image of a loving God. We do not have to wonder what God looks like. We need only look in the mirror, or look at our loved ones, the person at Starbucks who made our coffee this morning, or the person asking for help outside that same Starbucks. Everyone is made in the image and likeness of God. If we could truly embrace this reality so many conflicts in the world could be resolved. How could we discriminate against or hate another when we look at them and see God? How could we not love and care for ourselves if we see God when we look in the mirror? If every time we looked at our brothers and sisters on this earth we saw God looking back, how could there be war? How could there be hunger? How could we fail to care for each person with dignity and love?

Of course, like much that our God asks of us and wants for us, this is easier said than done. I believe that if we begin this recognition in small ways, with ourselves and those around us, we do as Jesus asks, we repay to God what belongs to God. It is not always easy, especially if we are confronted with someone with whom we may disagree, or who may have hurt us. Recognizing the image of God in another person does not mean that they are perfect, or even that we like them. It means that we see and acknowledge their individual identity and dignity as a child of God.

We have an excellent example of a ministry that upholds the dignity of each person and sees God in all they serve in our Falge Farmworker Program. I am very grateful to our Falge ministry leaders who spoke at our Masses and prepared an excellent video presentation for our website. I also thank all of you who gave so generously to support their work in ensuring that our farmworkers in the Salinas Valley have the food and supplies they need to care for their families. If you have not had a chance to do so, I invite you to view the video by visiting our website, carmelmission.org and clicking the link to watch our video messages. Guidelines for Attending Mass

The safety of our parishioners, staff, and celebrants is critically important as we come together. Per Diocesan guidelines Parishioners who are medically vulnerable or over the age of 65 should remain at home for now.

Parking: Parking for Sunday Masses will be available in the school lot. Access to the Mission will only be available through the Parishioner Parking lot gate.

Volunteers: Volunteer monitors and ushers are needed for our Sunday Masses. If you wish to volunteer please email Laura at liturgy@carmelmission.org. Access to the Sanctuary and Sacristy remains restricted to Staff only.

Weather and Outdoor Conditions: We are very fortunate to have such a large beautiful outdoor space in our Central Courtyard where we can celebrate Mass comfortably with appropriate social distancing.

In addition to distancing, we require attendees, including children, to stay in their seats and not move about the courtyard for any reason.

We are very concerned about the health of all who attend Mass and we must ensure that everyone maintains appropriate distancing and also hope that everyone can be comfortable in our outdoor setting. The weather can change suddenly, so please dress for variable conditions. We have limited seats in the shade, so please be prepared for the sun by bringing a hat or umbrella.

If at any time you are not comfortable, please get the attention of an Usher, who will assist with relocating you.

Financial stewardship: We will be taking up a collection at the Masses on Sundays. Electronic giving through carmelmission.org remains a preferred option, but also feel free to bring your weekly offering to Sunday Mass.



Scripture Message

Jesus' ongoing disagreement with the Pharisees reaches new heights in today's Gospel passage. After three pointed parables, in which Jesus lays bare their arrogance and their failure as leaders of the Jewish people, the Pharisees devise a trap for Jesus with their usual enemies, the Herodians. They pose what they believe to be a lose-lose question to Jesus regarding the paying of taxes. If Jesus says to pay the tax then He tacitly endorses the political system of the brutal and unpopular occupier, Cesar. If He says to not pay the tax then He proposes an overthrow of the political system and marks Himself as a revolutionary. But Jesus is quick to see through their trick, and shows again that they are thinking like men and not like God. By making the point that in returning the coin bearing Cesar's likeness to Cesar they are only returning what is already his, Jesus turns the tables on them, and blatantly calls them hypocrites. What then are we to repay to God? If we take Jesus' answer to the question literally, the coin should be returned to Cesar because it is made with his likeness on it. What is made in the image and likeness of God? Humankind. We are what must be given to God, as we are made by God in God's image. Our lives, our actions, our thoughts, our hopes and our dreams all belong to God. When we focus our lives on giving ourselves back to God, we repay what is God's due, and also embrace the work of making God's Kingdom. In what ways, large and small, do you repay God with your life?

A Prayer to Our Lady of the Rosary



Altar Flowers Opportunity




