Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Today we celebrate the feast of All Saints. As we remember our favorite saints, whose example has been an inspiration in our own life of faith, we are also encouraged that we too can join their number. Though few of us will become a canonized saint of the Catholic Church, not that I am counting any of you out, we are all called to develop the deep relationship with God and the attitude of service that characterizes the lives of all the saints.

Many of you may be aware that yesterday marked an important step in the journey to formal sainthood for one American parish priest, Fr. Michael McGivney. Fr. McGivney was beatified in a special Mass at St. Joseph's Cathedral in Hartford, CT and is now called "Blessed." This is an inspiration to all of us parish priests, that one of our number is so honored by the Church for his life of service. Likewise it is a special inspiration to all who are members of the fraternal order that Fr. McGivney founded, the Knights of Columbus.

Fr. McGivney's life exemplified the principles that Jesus presents in his Sermon on the Mount. He served the poor and the meek. He stood up for what was right at all costs. He worked to be a peacemaker and to bring peace and security to his community. His goal in founding the Knights of Columbus was to empower men to embrace and live these principles. Founded on the ideas of charity, unity and fraternity, the Knights of Columbus began as twenty four men gathering in the basement of their church in Connecticut and has grown to be the largest Catholic fraternal organization in the world, numbering over two million members.

We have many reasons to be grateful for Fr. McGivney's legacy. Foremost among them is our own local council of Knights who practice the values of charity and service in our community. Since the beginning of the COVID- 19 crisis, the Knights have been, as they have always been, a crucial source of support for our parish. It is said, "where there is a need, there is a Knight" and that has certainly proved true here at Carmel Mission. Thank you to all our Knights and congratulations on the beatification of your founder, Fr. McGivney.

The following is a letter from our Pastor, Fr. Paul to his fellow Knights of Columbus:



Dear Grand Knight Russell and Brother Knights,

As you are all aware, this weekend our beloved Founder, Fr. Michael McGivney, will be declared Blessed by our Holy Father, Pope Francis. This is a major milestone on his road to Canonization. Let's pray that it will not be long before our beloved Fraternity of Columbus has it's very own Saint. I have not the slightest doubt that he is already among that great multitude of Saints in heaven.

His life was marked by a deep spirituality which expressed itself in practical actions, as he reached out to widows and orphans, to the poor and the marginalized and brought them comfort and consolation as they tried to cope with the heavy burdens that they carried. He truly was a "man for others" and answered the call of Jesus Christ by becoming His priest.

On a personal note, it is gratifying that an American priest (with deep Irish roots!) is being so honored by our Church. We priests need such truly excellent role models, especially in these turbulent times. Fr. Michael knew well the cruelty of racism and the powerful oppressive force of anti-Catholicism. He had seen the signs "No Irish need apply" and he and his family had suffered the more subtle and insidious rejection "No Catholics need apply - beyond the basic grade". It is wishful thinking to believe that such racism rarely exists in our times and that anti-Catholicism no longer raises its ugly head.

Fr. Michael was not prepared to suffer such injustice in silence, but he chose the way of constructive confraternity cohesion rather than a very vocal and violent response. As we know, he gathered together a small group of committed Catholics in a church basement and they willingly and enthusiastically blazed a trail which has continued to our day, putting charity into action in their local community and having a profound influence for good on the wider world.

My brothers in Christ, you continue that great tradition of Catholic charity by your constant willingness to step up to the plate, as soon as a need arises. You display a great love of Our Savior Jesus Christ, by living out His Gospel in your daily life. You are amazing and you are an inspiration to me and to so many priests. Without the involvement of the Knights of Columbus over many years, our beloved Mission parish would not be the vibrant faith community that it so obviously is today.

Never a day goes by that I don't thank God for your presence. I have the constant comfort of knowing that you are only a phone call (or an email) away. I thank you for your constant support in so many different ways.

So, my Brother Knights, as we honor all the Saints this weekend, we thank God for the humble yet dynamic priesthood and life well-lived of Blessed Michael McGivney. In his short life of some thirty-eight years, he left us a lasting legacy in which we Knights of Columbus can justifiably take pride and confidently and courageously continue into the future.

My great gratitude to each of you, as we celebrate this very special day in the history of our Fraternity.

Weather and Outdoor Conditions: We are very fortunate to have such a large beautiful outdoor space in our Central Courtyard where we can celebrate Mass comfortably with appropriate social distancing.

In addition to distancing, we require attendees, including children, to stay in their seats and not move about the courtyard for any reason.

We are very concerned about the health of all who attend Mass and we must ensure that everyone maintains appropriate distancing and also hope that everyone can be comfortable in our outdoor setting. The weather can change suddenly, so please dress for variable conditions. We have limited seats in the shade, so please be prepared for the sun by bringing a hat or umbrella.

If at any time you are not comfortable, please get the attention of an Usher, who will assist with relocating you.




BREAKING BREAD 2021

Scripture Message

In his apostolic exhortation Rejoice and Be Glad, Pope Francis says of today's Gospel, "The Beatitudes are like a Christian's identity card. So if anyone asks: 'What must one do to be a good Christian?' the answer is clear" (63). Today we celebrate the feast of All Saints, when we honor the men and women who have answered the call to holiness that is a part of our baptismal promise. In our baptism we are each invited to a life of holiness, a sanctified life; we are invited to become a saint of God. We look at the lives of the saints as inspiration, but lest we ever feel daunted by their example, Jesus gives us the Beatitudes, a model for holiness. The poor, the meek, those who are mourning, the merciful, those who stand up for what is right at any cost, those who seek to bring peace, all are on the path to holiness. We can take our place among them with simple actions that embrace these principles. When we are merciful, when we seek to do what is right, when we act as peacemakers we are acting as the saints have done throughout the generations. In the reading from the Book of Revelation John sees a vision of those who have "washed their robes and made them white in the Blood of the Lamb." He describes, "a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people and tongue." This is our family, the family of God, reflecting the beautiful diversity of God's creation. We are all called to holiness, and to take our place, with the saints, in God's Kingdom. How do you embrace and live the Beatitudes?

Altar Flowers Opportunity




