# FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Here at Carmel Mission we choose a theme each year for our Advent season. The theme helps to guide our spiritual preparation through Advent, as we get ready to welcome Jesus into our world at Christmas. This year has been like no other in my lifetime. The sweeping and devastating effects of the global COVID – 19 pandemic, the national reckoning on racism and racial inequality, and a divisive political environment have touched each of us in ways we could not have imagined just last Advent. As I considered a theme for this Advent that would help us process, help us heal, and help us truly prepare, I was inspired by one of the songs we often sing, or at the present time listen to, at Mass, "In God Alone Is My Hope."

Advent is a time of great hope. We are hoping for the Light that is coming into the world. A Light that will shine in the darkness and that the darkness, any darkness, cannot begin to overcome. This hope was first held in the hearts of the Jewish people. The stories we hear in the Advent season, the readings from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, the stories of Mary and Elizabeth, of John the Baptist and Joseph, are all testaments to people whose hope was in God. Their faith and their courage were fueled by their hope for the Messiah and their confidence in God's promise.

We can do no better than to follow their example and put our hope in God alone. While our celebrations this Advent and Christmas may look superficially different from years past, at their core, they remain the same. We prepare in darkness to welcome the Light, we wait in hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We are confident that Jesus, the Light of the World, is coming, and we prepare our hearts and our minds to welcome Him anew.



Dear Falge Christmas Angels,

Two hallmarks of Advent in our Carmel Mission Community have been the Christmas Giving Tree and the distribution of empty grocery bags. Each paper angel ornament on the tree bore the name and age of a farmworker's child for whom we prayed, plus that child's hoped-for Christmas gift. Grocery bags bore a list of hoped-for food. In a small Christmas miracle, and thanks to the real-life angels of this community those paper angels disappeared from the tree – only to reappear attached to the hoped-for gift. The grocery bags also returned, filled with food, making it possible for farmworker families to prepare a special Christmas meal.

### Scripture Message

In the Gospel for this, the first Sunday of Advent, we hear Mark's telling of Jesus' last parable for His disciples before the series of events that will lead to His Passion and Death. Jesus is preparing his followers for the time that will come after his Death and Resurrection and before His Second Coming, a time we are still in today. The followers of Jesus have been "on watch" for over two thousand years with who knows how many more to come? In the parable the servants are not idle in their time while the Master is away. Rather, each has "his own work." The same is true for us, we have our own work to do to build the Kingdom of God. We share in this work not only with our brothers and sisters today but with every faithful person who has come before, who has taken up the work of the Kingdom, back to the very first disciples Jesus was speaking to in the parable. In this season of patient and joyous anticipation we have an opportunity to reflect on what work we are being called to do. How is this work helping us to stay watchful and alert? How is it helping to grow the Kingdom of God until the moment it reaches its fullness and we welcome the Master back home?

**Weather and Outdoor Conditions:** We are very fortunate to have such a large beautiful outdoor space in our Central Courtyard where we can celebrate Mass comfortably with appropriate social distancing.

In addition to distancing, we require attendees, including children, to stay in their seats and not move about the courtyard for any reason.

We are very concerned about the health of all who attend Mass and we must ensure that everyone maintains appropriate distancing and also hope that everyone can be comfortable in our outdoor setting. The weather can change suddenly, so please dress for variable conditions. We have limited seats in the shade, so please be prepared for the sun by bringing a hat or umbrella.

If at any time you are not comfortable, please get the attention of an Usher, who will assist with relocating you.
