FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

As we continue on our Advent journey we wait in hope for so many things. We wait for the coming of Christ at Christmas and His Second Coming at the end of time. We wait for the COVID-19 vaccine, and the end of this devastating pandemic. We wait to be able to safely see our family and friends again, indoors and without masks. We wait, sometimes patiently, sometimes not so patiently. All this waiting can feel passive and unengaging, but it need not be so.

It has been a while since most of us could welcome houseguests, but remember, if you will, the activities leading up to the anticipated arrival of a loved one. We clean the house, change the linens, purchase and prepare their favorite food and drink. We prepare in advance so that when they are with us we can enjoy their presence while ensuring that they feel welcome and loved. This is what the time of Advent is meant for, not a passive waiting, a countdown to Christmas. It is a time of the active preparation of our hearts, our homes and our community for the coming of Our Savior. Our God is coming to us, and we are called to "prepare the way of the Lord."

Preparing the way for the Lord is paving the road with God's justice. God's justice favors the poor, the lowly, the neglected and the marginalized. We have the opportunity this Advent season to prepare God's roads into our hearts and into our community. We are invited to examine our prejudices, our blind spots. We are encouraged to take action in our community to realize the justice of God's Kingdom here and now. We are anticipating the presence of the most important houseguest we will ever welcome. I invite you to join me this week in the work of cleaning, planning and preparing for His arrival.

Dear Falge Christmas Angels,

Two hallmarks of Advent in our Carmel Mission Community have been the Christmas Giving Tree and the distribution of empty grocery bags. Each paper angel ornament on the tree bore the name and age of a farmworker's child for whom we prayed, plus that child's hoped-for Christmas gift. Grocery bags bore a list of hoped-for food. In a small Christmas miracle, and thanks to the real-life angels of this community those paper angels disappeared from the tree – only to reappear attached to the hoped-for gift. The grocery bags also returned, filled with food, making it possible for farmworker families to prepare a special Christmas meal.

This Advent we are hoping that the real-life angels of this parish will, once again, fulfill farmworker families' hopes. Instead of buying gifts and groceries this year we ask that you donate money. Though you may not know a particular family's or child's name this year, please continue to pray for the health and safety of our farmworker families.

Scripture Message

In all the readings for today there is one common thread, the kindness and care of God for God's people. In the first reading from Isaiah, God speaks to God's people in exile, promising to lead them to freedom, to give comfort and forgive their sins. In the second letter of St. Peter, believed to be the last writing of the New Testament, Peter reminds a community coming to grips with the reality that the Second Coming of Christ is not as imminent as they had hoped that God's time is not our time. God does not delay, God waits with patience so that "all may come to repentance." In the Gospel, as God prepares to send His Son to the world, he first sends a messenger, John the Baptist, to prepare the people, calling them to repentance and baptism. Lastly in the psalm, we here that "Justice shall walk before Him and prepare the way of His steps." Justice paves the way for our loving and merciful God. When we undertake to realize God's justice in our world, a justice that lifts up the lowly, protects the vulnerable and helps the poor, we make ourselves and our world more ready for his coming, both at Christmas and at the end of time. How are you using this Advent season to advance God's justice and prepare the way of the Lord?





Weather and Outdoor Conditions: We are very fortunate to have such a large beautiful outdoor space in our Central Courtyard where we can celebrate Mass comfortably with appropriate social distancing.

In addition to distancing, we require attendees, including children, to stay in their seats and not move about the courtyard for any reason.

We are very concerned about the health of all who attend Mass and we must ensure that everyone maintains appropriate distancing and also hope that everyone can be comfortable in our outdoor setting. The weather can change suddenly, so please dress for variable conditions. We have limited seats in the shade, so please be prepared for the sun by bringing a hat or umbrella.

If at any time you are not comfortable, please get the attention of an Usher, who will assist with relocating you.





