# FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

At this moment, our world is crying out for the healing Jesus offered the people of Capernaum in today's Gospel. As we continue to struggle with the Covid-19 pandemic, and the physical, mental and emotional strains that it brings, we find ourselves in great need of Jesus' healing touch. The psalmist reminds us that God not only heals the mind, body and spirit, He also heals our broken hearts. Wherever God sees pain He wants to bring healing, comfort, and peace.

Though it can be, God's healing is not always a magic pill that immediately reverses our suffering. It is sometimes the comfort of a grief shared, a brief respite from anxiety, the assurance that we are not journeying through our pain alone. In the psalm, the people of Israel are returning from their Babylonian exile. Their country has been ravaged, the temple destroyed, their collective heart is broken. But their unshaken faith is in the Lord who heals the broken-hearted, who rebuilds Jerusalem, whose wisdom has no limit. Their faith is in the Lord but it is their hands that will rebuild the temple and their words that will comfort the mourning. They can be agents of God's healing because they know that they have never been alone, not in defeat, not in exile, and not in the work of rebuilding.

Simon's mother in law provides us with a powerful example of how we can respond to God's healing in our lives and become healers ourselves. Service was her reaction to healing, out of gratitude and out of compassion. We may well experience God's healing through the compassionate actions of our brothers and sisters. I invite you to join me this week in returning this in full measure, and sharing God's compassion and mercy with the world.

## Ash Wednesday - February 17, 2021

Please join us for Mass in the Central Courtyard at 4pm with the Distribution of Ashes

The Diocese of Monterey has adopted the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments' special anti-COVID 19 precautions in regards to the distribution of ashes. Ashes will be sprinkled on the head of each person, rather than marked on the forehead. This is the customary practice at the Vatican and this year is being adopted around the world. Given the spread of the coronavirus, the practice has the advantage of not requiring the priest, deacon or minister to touch multiple people.

In the Gospel today we encounter Jesus the healer, one of the focal points of His earthly ministry. Jesus' overwhelming compassion is such that He moves immediately to ease the suffering of those who are in need. After healing Simon's mother in law, Jesus finds that much of the town of Capernaum is in need of healing of mind, body or spirit. He pours Himself out in compassion for them, giving them the wholeness that they are longing for. Having done this Jesus turns to God in pray, seeking time alone with God. This is not to last as the disciples are in pursuit. Simon even goes so far as to gently rebuke Jesus, "Everyone is looking for you," failing to recognize Jesus's need to be with His Father. Exhausted as He must have been, Jesus tells the disciples that they must move on, He needs to preach and heal in other places throughout Galilee. Though He commanded the demons He cast out not to speak of Him, for they recognized Him as the Son of God, He continues to fulfill His own destiny by His actions, "For this purpose have I come." An example for us is to be found in Simon's unnamed mother in law. Her reaction to being healed to was to serve. When have you experienced God's compassion and healing? How did that inspire you to serve God and God's people in return?

### The Covid Pandemic Special Edition

#### The Fascinini Columns

Finding the provenance of items in the Carmel Mission can be a fun treasure hunt. The beautiful Reredos behind the altar is a trove in itself.



Those four large columns flanking La Purisima on the left and St. Bonaventure on the right have an interesting and local history.


In 1856, benefactor Francisco Pacheco donated funds to embellish and enlarge the Royal Presidio Chapel in Monterey. The pastor at that time was Fr. Sorrentini. The new altar and reredos was a very elaborate affair. It was built by artisan Paulo Fascinini, an Italian craftsman who had come with the Gold Rush and had done much of the plaster work for the local dance halls and saloons in Monterey. He built the altar and reredos of redwood and coated it with plaster. The design featured four large columns.



In 1942, Harry Downie, master builder of the missions, undertook a massive restoration of the Presidio Chapel. The reredos was in good condition, however it had a very Victorian aspect and was

painted white and gold. Downie wished to retain the reredos, but repaint it in the Spanish era colors. Fr. Durkin, pastor at that time, "wanted none of it. He wanted it plain." Downie retrieved parts of it. The four columns were saved for use at Carmel Mission.

Harry Downie and crew designed and built the present reredos at the Carmel Mission in 1956. It was commissioned by and paid for by Mrs. Marie Farrell Hart. The reredos was built in 17 sections in the workshop that was down by the orchard house, carried in pieces up to the church and attached to new framing behind the altar. Harry's original design drawings can be seen in the Downie Museum. After 14 years in storage, the 100 year old Fascinini columns were restored, repainted and featured once again, in a new home.
