FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

This year we have chosen for our Lenten theme "Led By The Spirit." The forty days of Lent commemorate the forty days that Jesus spent alone in the desert wilderness, facing temptation, fasting, and praying to His Father. The Spirit led Jesus into the desert to help prepare Him for the greatest test, His Passion, and the greatest triumph, His Resurrection. We invite the Spirit to lead us on a similar journey, not perhaps into a literal wilderness, but into the wilderness of our hearts and minds. We pray that this journey will help prepare us to accept the suffering of the Cross as the path to liberation, setting us free to rise with Christ again at Easter.

In a line from the hymn that inspired our theme God says, "Rend not your garments, rend your hearts. Turn back your lives to me." (Joel 2:13) To rend our hearts is to open them to God's infinite love and boundless mercy. There is a time honored tradition in our faith of "giving something up" for the season of Lent. This year, as we allow the Spirit to lead us into our personal wildernesses, let us use this practice of self-discipline to root out those things which are keeping us captive. We may not overcome them in the forty days of Lent, it may be the journey of our lifetime, but these forty days of mindfulness could be life-changing.

With our most merciful God, repentance is not punishment, it is renewal. When we repent, we listen to God guiding us away from the attitudes that imprison us towards the attitudes that set us free. The Spirit is leading us to freedom, if only we will follow.

I wish you and your loved ones Lenten blessings of peace and renewal, and may your hearts be made free with Easter joy,

Scripture Message

The concise Gospel reading from Mark today paints a vivid picture for our imaginations. Jesus, alone in the wilderness, spending time with wild beasts, angels, and the temptations of the Devil. That He emerged unscathed to proclaim that "This is the time of fulfillment," is proof that He overcame temptation and was not eaten by the wild beasts. It is also an indication at that during that time Jesus came to terms with the duality of His nature as both fully human and fully divine. Driven into this time of solitude by the Holy Spirit, Jesus accepted the challenges of living with and embracing both the beasts and the angels. His resolve was such that Satan could not tempt Him to stray from the path of ministry and service before Him. Jesus came out of His time in the wilderness strengthened and ready for His work on earth, announcing that the "Kingdom of God is at hand." We are encouraged in this Lenten season to follow the Spirit into our own wildernesses, to seek out the beasts and the angels in our hearts, and to reconcile and focus them on our mission of discipleship, to build the Kingdom of God, and proclaim the Good News of the Gospel. Where is the Spirit leading you this Lent?

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

I hope and pray that you and your loved ones are safe and well, as we embark on our faith journey through this special year of 2021, during which we celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the founding of our beautiful Mission by Saint Junípero Serra.

This is a year of RECOVERY and RENEWAL, a time to celebrate our past achievements and to plan for our future. While it is obviously true that conditions and restrictions of 2020 impacted our parish, both materially and spiritually, we have not been idle. We have used the time wisely to explore new and innovative ways to keep our community together and to plan for our future.

Who could have predicted how important the timing of our 2020 AMA Heavenly Sounds Campaign would be? The console of our beautiful Casavant organ has been restored and updated by its original makers and is awaiting re-installation. We have invested in a superb outdoor sound system for our masses in our Central Courtyard. We have been broadcasting mass on our website and our YouTube channel, which has enabled us to gather as a virtual community, and which is of particular benefit to those parishioners who are unable to attend mass in person.

It is time to launch our 2021 AMA (Annual Ministry Appeal). Our diocese has chosen the theme "Building a Family of Faith". I enclose an AMA information leaflet which indicates the range of ministries that you support by participating in the campaign. The first \$52,000 raised goes back to the diocese, and any sum we raise over that sum, comes back to our parish for RECOVERY and RENEWAL during our 250th Anniversary year. At Carmel Mission, we have set a total goal of \$250,000. We will use the additional \$198,000 to increase our efforts at building up our virtual family of faith. We plan to enhance our filming and digital communication capabilities through the investment in state of the art equipment and upgrades to our wireless infrastructure.

With the addition of our new Central Courtyard Restrooms, currently under construction, and the renovation of the Downie Museum and Basilica Forecourt, planned for this Spring, we will also invest in improving safety and access to our beautiful Mission. We will also expand our Museum exhibition space, in order to attract and welcome more visitors and pilgrims, whose support we greatly appreciate and rely on. We will share our progress towards achieving our goals on a dedicated page on our website and our weekly bulletin. In each of the past three years, your generosity has enabled us to achieve our AMA goals: Upgrade of Crespi Parish Hall, Renew Our Pews, and Heavenly Sounds. We could not have done this without you. I thank you from the bottom of my heart.

During this 250th Anniversary year, I know that I can count on your selfless stewardship and your generous support of our beautiful Carmel Mission.

Our Lady of Lourdes

About Lourdes



Lourdes is a small town in southwestern France that became famous for the Marian appearance of Our Lady of Lourdes in 1858. On February 11 of that year a beautiful lady appeared before a 14-year-old, Bernadette Soubirous in the remote Grotto of Massabielle. The lady later appeared another 17 times, and identified herself as “the Immaculate Conception” and told Bernadette to tell people this: “I am the Immaculate Conception, go drink at the spring and bathe in its waters.”

Although no water was in plain sight, Bernadette began to dig in the area indicated by Our Lady and a spring began to flow.

Since 1860, the Roman Catholic Church has officially recognized 67 miraculous healings that have come to those who drank or bathed in Lourdes Grotto Water.

Today, Lourdes is the single greatest Catholic pilgrimage site in France, one of the largest pilgrimage and Catholic shrine sites in the world, and the single most famous modern shrine to Our Lady.

The Covid Pandemic Special Edition

Who sponsored the Carmel Mission Reredos?

Historically, religious art has sponsors. The Carmel mission is no exception.

The sanctuary of the church was hardly as we know it now when the mission was first restored in 1884 under Fr. Casanova. There were three steps at the altar rail and another 5 up to the predella and the altar. This also caused the need for steps down into the Sacristy. Following the great effort to restore the original roof completed in 1936, Harry Downie undertook the restoration of the Sanctuary in 1943. Among many other tasks was the re-creation of a more magnificent Reredos more closely matching the original from the Spanish era, and those of other missions. We will cover that design effort in a future "Corner".

The sources used as reference for the design would be both historic and new.

Bayard Taylor (1825- 1878), american journalist, described the original altar from his visit in 1849. Mrs. Marianne Goold (1884-1975), daughter of Christiano Machado (1838-1924), caretaker of the mission, and her family described the reredos and altar in the period before the 1884 restoration.


Harry Downie was of course familiar with the reredos of Mission San Francisco de Asis and considered it to be a good example of Spanish period design.

But, funds were short following the 1943 restoration and the related exhumation of Serra. The reredos design remained in Harry's mind for over a dozen years. And the Fascinini columns lay in storage.

In late 1955 Fr. O' Connell made an appeal that "it would be nice to restore... a reredos in the Mission", and parishioner and Peninsula resident Mrs. Marcia Farrell Hart offered to fund it.

Harry Downie met with her, but he had no idea how much it would cost and although he had thought about it for many years, the plan had not "gelled ", as he put it.

He drafted up a sketch in a day, using the references he knew of and also working around the imperfect dimensions of the church and the sizes of the statues that would be incorporated.



DOCENT CORNER (CONTINUED)

Marcia Farrell Hart was a member of the Board of Directors at Santa Catalina School, an heiress to a traction railroad fortune, and was married to George Hart, a saloon piano player she had met following her divorce from her first husband, copper magnate John Keresey.



In 1954 she donated the funds to build the Rosary Chapel and its furnishings at Santa Catalina School, hiring the renowned San Francisco architect Germano Milono FAIA.

Harry Downie and his assistant Rafael Torres built the reredos in six months. The drawing that Harry created is on display in the Harry Downie Museum at Carmel Mission.





9:00 AM Mass will be Held Indoors at 25% Capacity with Outdoor Overflow

9:00 AM Mass will be celebrated in the Basilica at 25% capacity with overflow seating in the Central Courtyard. We are now permitted to return to worship inside the Basilica under the following conditions:

- Capacity is 25% of the church. Only family households may sit together. We will be seating people from front to back on a first come, first served basis. Dismissal at the end of Mass will begin with those in the back. Please note that depending on how the pews are filled capacity may be met before all the available seats are filled. We cannot exceed 25% capacity under any circumstances.
- Social distancing protocols remain in effect indoors and outdoors.
- Face coverings must be worn at all times, without exception, indoors and outdoors. Temperatures will be taken.

11:00 AM Mass will continue to be celebrated outdoors only in the Central Courtyard unless the weather conditions require us to move indoors at 25% capacity.

Weather and Outdoor Conditions: We are very fortunate to have such a large beautiful outdoor space in our Central Courtyard where we can celebrate Mass comfortably with appropriate social distancing.

In addition to distancing, we require attendees, including children, to stay in their seats and not move about the courtyard for any reason.

We are very concerned about the health of all who attend Mass and we must ensure that everyone maintains appropriate distancing and also hope that everyone can be comfortable in our outdoor setting. The weather can change suddenly, so please dress for variable conditions. We have limited seats in the shade, so please be prepared for the sun by bringing a hat or umbrella.

If at any time you are not comfortable, please get the attention of an Usher, who will assist with relocating you.
