FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

As I read the Gospel today I could not help but think that Jesus must have been experiencing a "Groundhog's Day" moment with His disciples. He had been trying for weeks to explain to them what awaits Him in Jerusalem as well as the true meaning of His mission and their discipleship. Despite his efforts James and John remain fixated on the idea of His coming glory, a tangible victory, and their place in it, hopefully at His right and left hands. The other ten disciples' indignation is based more on their fear of being displaced than their awareness of the inappropriateness of the brothers' demand.

Fortunately for the disciples, and for all of us, it is as the Letter to the Hebrews says; Jesus is fully aware of the failings of our human nature. He understands the human inclination to self-interest. He patiently tries, again, to show the disciples that true greatness lies not in power, prestige or authority but rather in humble service to one another.

Last weekend we had our first events to celebrate the 250th anniversary of the founding of Carmel Mission. This remarkable milestone caused me to reflect on the life and the work of our founder and first pastor, St. Junipero Serra. St. Junipero embraced God's call to service with an open and loving heart. He encountered his fair share of suffering, both personal physical suffering as well as the many challenges presented to him in the New World. He understood the paradox of Jesus' Good News, that to share in His glory is to share in His suffering, and never let this embitter or discourage him.

This is the legacy that we carry forward here at Carmel Mission. I invite you to join me this week in praying that we are granted the wisdom and the strength to chart a future for our community that continues the vital work of welcome that St. Junipero began 250 years ago.

Scripture Message

Jesus' gentle patience with His disciples is on full display in today's Gospel. Despite all that He has been teaching them, and the clear explanation He has offered of what awaits Him in Jerusalem, they remain fixated on tangible victory, and want to assure themselves of pride of place when Jesus comes into His glory. It is fortunate for them that, as the Letter to the Hebrews states, their high priest can sympathize with their human weaknesses. Jesus understands the failings in their nature that cause them be power hungry and self-centered. Rather than turning away from them in annoyance at their failure to grasp the true significance of Jesus's mission, He tries again to instruct them on how to attain what they truly desire, closeness and connection to God. Jesus reminds them that He Himself came not to be served but to serve, and to offer up His life for all. By modeling themselves after Him, making themselves servants to one another, they can attain true greatness, in this life and the next. Jesus challenges them, asking if they can truly drink His cup and share in His baptism, knowing that they will fail this test at the moment of His Passion and Death, but knowing also that through the mercy of God, and the power of the Holy Spirit, they will overcome this failure and participate in the glory of His Resurrection. There is a paradox in Jesus's Good News, for a share in His glory, there must be a share as well in His suffering. In this is both a challenge and a consolation for the disciples and for us.

FORECOURT RENOVATION

The restoration and seismic retrofit of the Sir Harry Downie Museum and the Basilica Forecourt started on April 5 and is off to a great start. The construction is expected to continue through the fall when we look forward to celebrating the 250th anniversary of the founding of the Mission. Access to the property from the Basilica entrance gates through to the Crespi lot will be off limits until the completion of construction.




The project calls for a completely new courtyard surface and walkways, which will be regraded and expanded to allow for improved ADA accessibility. The Downie building's interior will be renovated to allow more exhibition space along with the creation of 2 ADA compliant restrooms. The fountain will be restored as the centerpiece of refreshed garden beds.





DOCENT CORNER:

Father Francisco Paloú

Fr. Paloú was born in 1722 in Palma, Majorca. He joined the Franciscan Order around the age of 17 where Fr. Junipero Serra became his mentor and teacher. Both men eagerly joined the missions serving the American Indians and reached Vera Cruz, Mexico in 1749. Fr. Juan Crespi, another student and lifelong friend of Fr. Serra's also agreed to join them.

For almost 20 years Paloú worked in the missions of Mexico (Sierra Gorda) and Texas. In 1767, he and 14 other Franciscan friars went to Baja California to replace the Jesuit missionaries who had been expelled by King Charles III of Spain.

He became the "Presidente" or superior of the Baja missions when Fr. Serra went on to Alta California with the Portolá expedition in 1769. When the Baja missions were turned over to the Dominicans in 1773, Fr. Paloú was able to again serve with Fr. Serra in Alta California.

Fr. Serra was using Carmel as his headquarters and it was there that Fr. Paloú joined him. It also was there that he started one of the most notable legacies of his life: writing the history of the early California missions from 1767 to 1784. His 4-volume set of "Noticias" with the history of the 9 missions from San Diego to San Buenaventura and the life of Fr. Serra gives us some of the only surviving information we have today of the early California missions.



Collecting historical data and writing was only part of his work. He helped place friars in numerous missions and was the first priest to reach the San Francisco Bay on an exploring expedition with Captain Rivera in 1774. In 1776, he was tasked by Fr. Serra to establish Mission San Francisco (Mission Dolores). He remained there until Fr. Serra called him to Carmel to give him the last rights in 1784. He was at Fr. Serra's bedside when he died on 28 August and vividly describes the event in his history.

His responsibilities increased on Serra's death because he became the acting Presidente of the Alta California missions. He remained in

Carmel for about a year until his failing health and age required that he return to the College of San Fernando in Mexico City in September of 1785. He was replaced by Fr. Lasuén as Presidente of the Missions. He was elected guardian of the College of San Fernando and became an advocate of the Indians in the vice-regal court to defend their rights as well as those of the missionaries.

Fr. Paloú held this office until his death at age 66. Throughout his life he was described by various people as humble, pious, a tireless traveler, a loyal disciple, and fair-minded historian of California.

This insight into the Mission history was provided by the Carmel Mission Docent Association.





Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

I hope and pray that you and your loved ones are safe and well, as we embark on our faith journey through this special year of 2021, during which we celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the founding of our beautiful Mission by Saint Junípero Serra.

This is a year of RECOVERY and RENEWAL, a time to celebrate our past achievements and to plan for our future. While it is obviously true that conditions and restrictions of 2020 impacted our parish, both materially and spiritually, we have not been idle. We have used the time wisely to explore new and innovative ways to keep our community together and to plan for our future.

Who could have predicted how important the timing of our 2020 AMA Heavenly Sounds Campaign would be? The console of our beautiful Casavant organ has been restored and updated by it's original makers and is awaiting re-installation. We have invested in a superb outdoor sound system for our masses in our Central Courtyard. We have been broadcasting mass on our website and our YouTube channel, which has enabled us to gather as a virtual community, and which is of particular benefit to those parishioners who are unable to attend mass in person.

It is time to launch our 2021 AMA (Annual Ministry Appeal). Our diocese has chosen the theme "Building a Family of Faith". I enclose an AMA information leaflet which indicates the range of ministries that you support by participating in the campaign. The first \$52,000 raised goes back to the diocese, and any sum we raise over that sum, comes back to our parish for RECOVERY and RENEWAL during our 250th Anniversary year. At Carmel Mission, we have set a total goal of \$250,000. We will use the additional \$198,000 to increase our efforts at building up our virtual family of faith. We plan to enhance our filming and digital communication capabilities through the investment in state of the art equipment and upgrades to our wireless infrastructure.

With the addition of our new Central Courtyard Restrooms, currently under construction, and the renovation of the Downie Museum and Basilica Forecourt, planned for this Spring, we will also invest in improving safety and access to our beautiful Mission. We will also expand our Museum exhibition space, in order to attract and welcome more visitors and pilgrims, whose support we greatly appreciate and rely on. We will share our progress towards achieving our goals on a dedicated page on our website and our weekly bulletin. In each of the past three years, your generosity has enabled us to achieve our AMA goals: Upgrade of Crespi Parish Hall, Renew Our Pews, and Heavenly Sounds. We could not have done this without you. I thank you from the bottom of my heart.

During this 250th Anniversary year, I know that I can count on your selfless stewardship and your generous support of our beautiful Carmel Mission.


