FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

The moment has finally arrived. After an Advent of preparation and anticipation, we welcome our Savior once again into the world this Christmas. However many Christmases you have already experienced, this is a fresh opportunity to embrace the wonder, joy and mystery of the Incarnation.

In the Gospel for Christmas Eve we hear from Luke, the physician, the precise scholar for whom accuracy and detail were of primary importance. Luke first gives us historical and political perspective. This was the year of the first enrollment decreed by Caesar Augustus. Joseph and his pregnant wife Mary must travel to Bethlehem because of his family lineage. A lineage which will connect his soon to be born child to the foundations of Israel, to Abraham, the father of the nation and to David, Israel's eminent king. Mary's labor is upon her, and there is nowhere for them to shelter except a stable. The very human child is wrapped in swaddling clothes, and, lacking a crib, is laid in the animals' manger.

In the Gospel for Christmas Day, the Evangelist John, the mystic, also tells us an origin story. He takes us to the very beginning of existence. Before anything else existed, there was the Word. The Word was both with God and was God. Everything that was created, that has occurred, that has life today is the result of God's Word.

Two stories, very different and yet also the same. It is the duality of the Word, which existed before existence, and the baby Jesus, born in a stable in Bethlehem two thousand and twenty-two years ago that is the heart of our mysterious and magnificent faith. It is how all things came to be, and it is how we know each Christmas the Good News we are called to share with our fragile, wounded, and beautiful world. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not, cannot, and will never overcome it. Merry Christmas!

Scripture Message

In the Christmas Gospels we have a broad range of narratives surrounding the birth of the Savior. In the Gospel for the Vigil Mass we hear the genealogy of Jesus. The evangelist Matthew begins his Gospel by tracing Jesus' family lineage to Abraham, the father of the Jewish people, and David, Israel's eminent King. Matthew makes clear that family and lineage is important, but also not perfect. The inclusion of Rahab, a Canaanite woman who hid Israeli spies in her home, signals that the Gospel promise will extend beyond the Jewish people to embrace all nations. At the Mass in the night we hear from the evangelist Luke who tells the Christmas story. Jesus, born in a humble barn with only the faithful Joseph to attend the laboring Mary. God, wanting to spread the Good News of His Son's birth sends a peaceful army of angels, the Twitter and Facebook of their time, to get the word out. The shepherds, likely initially skeptical of the apparition of the angels, decide to check it out and thus become the first witnesses and the first worshippers of the newborn King. Lastly, at the Mass for Christmas Day, the evangelist John takes us back to the very beginning, a different kind of genealogy. Before the creation of the world, before existence, there was God. Jesus, the Word, was with God and was God. All things are made possible by this duality. This pre-creation narrative mirrors what we hear in Genesis, "In the beginning." Just as in the creation story, everything begins with light. The true light, that enlightens everyone, has come into the world. Merry Christmas!



DOCENT CORNER



La Noche Buena – Christmas Eve

Christmas Eve Masses at the new modern era Carmel Mission Parish bore some of the characteristic charms and curiosities often experienced in first time event planning. New Curator Harry Downie arrived at a time of transition for the old Mission. He had to improvise arrangements and accommodations for the celebration, thus some were typically ad hoc.

When Harry took up residence in the Carmel Mission guest rectory in 1931, he used oil lamps for illumination and the Jo Mora designed fireplace for heat. Masses in the Mission were illuminated by candlelight. Shortly after that electricity was being installed in Carmel-by-the-Sea and power lines were extended down San Carlos Street to Rio Road in front of the Mission.

Although new light fixtures were installed in the Church, for the earliest celebrations of Christmas Eve, La Noche Buena, the decision was made to continue holding Midnight Mass by candlelight. Certainly, it enhanced the beauty of the newly restored art and architecture, but it also underscored the theology of the birth of Christ, the Light of the World.

Although electricity was now installed heating the large Mission required a process of trial-and-error, testing different techniques over a period which would eventually span ten years. So, in his characteristic style of adaptive reuse, Harry repurposed the original large metal cooking pots from the Convento kitchen which had been used to cook atole and posole during the Franciscan Era. He filled the large pots with charcoal and firewood, distributed them throughout the church and they were kept burning throughout the celebration.

Harry described a "very good choir", accompanied by multiple violins. The Mass quickly became so popular throughout the Monterey Peninsula it was determined that tickets would have to be issued. Parishioners were the first to be entitled to receive these, guaranteeing them a seat. The large overflow crowd stood for the service.

For a traditional Christmas Vigil procession to begin the liturgy Harry built a crib and placed it in front of the altar. Taking one of the statues of the Christ Child which he had in storage, he wrapped it and handed it to the celebrant at the back of the Church. He then climbed the circular stone stairway to the choir loft and rang the bells to announce the Mass was about to begin. Once the procession reached the crib in the front, the Priest placed the child in it, blessed it, and began the Midnight Mass liturgy for La Noche Buena.

Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.



FINANCE COUNCIL REPORT

As members of the Parish Finance Council, we are uniquely positioned to see the extraordinary efforts of our priests, Fr. Paul and Fr. Rodrigo, who in trying times, continued their pastoral duties for all their parishioners. Perhaps we take that too much for granted. Those pastoral efforts are greatly appreciated and needed for all of us who are blessed to be in this community.

But in times of financial and COVID stress, Fr. Paul, in particular, is called to the daunting task of managing the finances and maintaining the services to our community.

These burdens are heavy in normal times. The burdens during this past year were beyond anyone's imagination. Fr. Paul worked tirelessly to restructure debt, provide access and services to the fullest extent allowable and transitioned our parish to a place we can be confident will not only survive, but prosper. His efforts ensure our contributions to the community through the sacraments and the ministries will survive and grow.

Please take a moment to express your thanks to our priests. They deserve it.

Here is a synopsis of the year's financial report:

Collections were down	15%
Income from services were down	25%
Gifts & donations were up	35%
Facility rental was up	100%
Salaries/wages were down	6%
Total expenses were down	7%

AMA CAMPAIGN

I do not think anyone could have imagined the need or the benefit provided by the contributors to our AMA campaign. This fundraising effort, led by chairman, Paul Hoffman, generated historic contributions in our 250th anniversary year. The unknown challenges we faced made each dollar contributed important to the survival of the parish during the shutdown and funded the changes necessary to restart the services to our community. When we were prohibited from gathering inside our sacred Basilica, the funds you raised allowed us to obtain the sound system and other equipment necessary to broadcast masses to those at home and conduct masses and weddings outdoors. While the clergy and staff made the extraordinary effort to make everything work, the services would not have been possible without the generous participation and contributions of all our parishioners in support of our only fundraiser. Many thank for all your contributions.

STAFF EFFORTS

No annual report would be complete without acknowledging the extra efforts of our wonderful staff. Although reduced in number due to financial constraints the shutdowns caused, the staff graciously addressed ever changing conditions over the past year. Our General Manager, Justin Burke, shepherded the staff through these challenges and staff members continually stepped up. They provided a safe environment for all although plans for a Mass or a Wedding were forced to be modified only hours earlier. Please extend an extra thank you to every staff member you see. Without them we would not have enjoyed the rapid return of the services we all missed.

DEBT CONSOLIDATION AND RESTRUCTURING

The Parish Finance Council and all parishioners are most grateful to Bishop Danny and the Diocese of Monterey for their assistance in restructuring our debt obligations. The expenses related to the school operations and renovation, together with the elimination of all visitor admissions, had placed us in a precarious financial position. The Diocese helped the Mission restructure its debt in a manner that not only averted a potential crisis but will allow us to continue and grow the sacramental services that are so valuable to our community and visitors.

FORECOURT RENOVATION - CARMEL MISSION FOUNDATION

I hope you have all taken the time to visit and walk through the wonderful Basilica Forecourt and Downie Museum restoration. Once again, we are grateful for the extraordinary efforts of the Carmel Mission Foundation, their Executive Director, Stephanie Zelei, and their Board of Directors

PARISH MINISTRIES - RETURN TO SERVICE

Throughout the pandemic we have been fortunate to have the continued support of our many wonderful ministries. They, along with our staff, have had adapt to the changing conditions imposed by the pandemic, not just once or twice, but often.

Our liturgical ministers were, and continue to be, on the front lines as we were able to return to Mass in person with a variety of permutations. We were outdoors, indoors with distancing, indoors without distancing and a hybrid of indoors with the option of outdoor overflow, as we currently have. In addition, health and safety protocols must be understood and communicated with our parishioners and our many weekly visitors. We are grateful for their flexibility and commitment to service.

Our Choir was able to return to active participation at our Masses in June, and we are very excited for the return of Lessons and Carols this Christmas season.

Our Bereavement ministry has been able to return to their important work of supporting families in their time of greatest need. We have been conducting Funerals and Memorial Masses for those who passed away during the lockdown time of the pandemic as well as the recently deceased in our community.

Our Knights of Columbus made a triumphant return to their pancake breakfasts in November, and we look forward to more events with them in the New Year.

LEGACY SOCIETY




MASSES ONLINE

In order to welcome more visitors, pilgrims and parishioners to our restored Forecourt, we have added an extra gated entrance at the side of our Museum Store.

We continue to move "Always forward...", with great hope in our hearts and an undiminished commitment to preserve and enhance our beautiful Carmel Mission for generations to come.

I hope and pray that you and your loved ones are safe and well, as we embark on our faith journey through this special year of 2021, during which we celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the founding of our beautiful Mission by Saint Junípero Serra.

This is a year of RECOVERY and RENEWAL, a time to celebrate our past achievements and to plan for our future. While it is obviously true that conditions and restrictions of 2020 impacted our parish, both materially and spiritually, we have not been idle. We have used the time wisely to explore new and innovative ways to keep our community together and to plan for our future.

Who could have predicted how important the timing of our 2020 AMA Heavenly Sounds Campaign would be? The console of our beautiful Casavant organ has been restored and updated by it's original makers and is awaiting re-installation. We have invested in a superb outdoor sound system for our masses in our Central Courtyard. We have been broadcasting mass on our website and our YouTube channel, which has enabled us to gather as a virtual community, and which is of particular benefit to those parishioners who are unable to attend mass in person.

It is time to launch our 2021 AMA (Annual Ministry Appeal). Our diocese has chosen the theme "Building a Family of Faith". I enclose an AMA information leaflet which indicates the range of ministries that you support by participating in the campaign. The first \$52,000 raised goes back to the diocese, and any sum we raise over that sum, comes back to our parish for RECOVERY and RENEWAL during our 250th Anniversary year. At Carmel Mission, we have set a total goal of \$250,000. We will use the additional \$198,000 to increase our efforts at building up our virtual family of faith. We plan to enhance our filming and digital communication capabilities through the investment in state of the art equipment and upgrades to our wireless infrastructure.

With the addition of our new Central Courtyard Restrooms, currently under construction, and the renovation of the Downie Museum and Basilica Forecourt, planned for this Spring, we will also invest in improving safety and access to our beautiful Mission. We will also expand our Museum exhibition space, in order to attract and welcome more visitors and pilgrims, whose support we greatly appreciate and rely on. We will share our progress towards achieving our goals on a dedicated page on our website and our weekly bulletin. In each of the past three years, your generosity has enabled us to achieve our AMA goals: Upgrade of Crespi Parish Hall, Renew Our Pews, and Heavenly Sounds. We could not have done this without you. 




