FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

In today's Gospel we meet more members of the familiar cast of characters in the Christmas story, the Magi. Often in Sacred Scripture the people we encounter are examples of who our loving God is encouraging us to be. In studying their interaction with God, we may discover ways in which God is communicating with us. While not much is historically known about the Magi, today I want to focus on what we do know from the Gospel, and what we may be able to learn from their example.

The Magi were curious and courageous. They had studied the ancient prophecies and they were searching the night sky for portents. When they see the star indicating the birth of a King they set out on the journey to pay Him homage. I do not know about you, but for me, celestial navigation through the desert to another country would definitely require a leap of faith!

The Magi listened more than they spoke. They asked questions and listened to the answers. They discerned for themselves what was valuable, the wisdom of the Hebrew Scriptures, and what was not, Herod's attempt to manipulate them into helping him cling to political power.

Finally, the Magi were open to God's communication. God spoke to the Magi through His creation, the natural world, and the Magi were ready to listen. He also spoke to them through His angels in a dream, warning them not to return to Herod, and again, they listened and obeyed. They were ready to encounter God wherever they found Him, even in a cold stable in a foreign land.

Our God invites us to be curious and inquisitive about the world in which we live, His creation. God encourages us to ask questions, pursue understanding and wisdom, and use the discernment and good judgment He has given us. God communicates with us constantly in myriad ways. The Magi remind us to be open to the unlikely, and when needed, be courageous in our journey of faith.

Scripture Message

The Magi are a historically controversial but theologically crucial part of the Christmas story. It is not from scripture, but rather from the writings of the 8th Century English saint, Bede the Venerable that we have their supposed number, 3, and their supposed names, Melchior, Caspar and Balthasar. From the Gospels we have no such details, and the Magi could have been any number of people, men and/or women, of a variety of nationalities. What is certain from the context of the Scriptures is that they were not Jewish. Also indicated is that they were intelligent, learned, courageous, open minded, adventurous, and sufficiently canny to realize when Herod is trying to manipulate them into doing his dirty work. At the time of Jesus' birth the Israelites had been God's chosen people for over two thousand years. The visit of the Magi was the first indication that God was extending the Abrahamic covenant beyond the Hebrew people. In his letter to the Ephesians St. Paul explicitly states that the Gentiles are coheirs and copartners in the promise of salvation. While this is a fairly routine notion today, it was wildly radical to early Christians in the years following Jesus' resurrection and it began the week after Jesus' birth, when national leaders with no ethnic relation to Israel came and payed homage to a Hebrew baby living with his family in a stable in Bethlehem.





Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.



FINANCE COUNCIL REPORT

As members of the Parish Finance Council, we are uniquely positioned to see the extraordinary efforts of our priests, Fr. Paul and Fr. Rodrigo, who in trying times, continued their pastoral duties for all their parishioners. Perhaps we take that too much for granted. Those pastoral efforts are greatly appreciated and needed for all of us who are blessed to be in this community.

But in times of financial and COVID stress, Fr. Paul, in particular, is called to the daunting task of managing the finances and maintaining the services to our community.

These burdens are heavy in normal times. The burdens during this past year were beyond anyone's imagination. Fr. Paul worked tirelessly to restructure debt, provide access and services to the fullest extent allowable and transitioned our parish to a place we can be confident will not only survive, but prosper. His efforts ensure our contributions to the community through the sacraments and the ministries will survive and grow.

Please take a moment to express your thanks to our priests. They deserve it.

Here is a synopsis of the year's financial report:

Collections were down	15%
Income from services were down	25%
Gifts & donations were up	35%
Facility rental was up	100%
Salaries/wages were down	6%
Total expenses were down	7%

AMA CAMPAIGN

I do not think anyone could have imagined the need or the benefit provided by the contributors to our AMA campaign. This fundraising effort, led by chairman, Paul Hoffman, generated historic contributions in our 250th anniversary year. The unknown challenges we faced made each dollar contributed important to the survival of the parish during the shutdown and funded the changes necessary to restart the services to our community. When we were prohibited from gathering inside our sacred Basilica, the funds you raised allowed us to obtain the sound system and other equipment necessary to broadcast masses to those at home and conduct masses and weddings outdoors. While the clergy and staff made the extraordinary effort to make everything work, the services would not have been possible without the generous participation and contributions of all our parishioners in support of our only fundraiser. Many thank for all your contributions.

STAFF EFFORTS

No annual report would be complete without acknowledging the extra efforts of our wonderful staff. Although reduced in number due to financial constraints the shutdowns caused, the staff graciously addressed ever changing conditions over the past year. Our General Manager, Justin Burke, shepherded the staff through these challenges and staff members continually stepped up. They provided a safe environment for all although plans for a Mass or a Wedding were forced to be modified only hours earlier. Please extend an extra thank you to every staff member you see. Without them we would not have enjoyed the rapid return of the services we all missed.

DEBT CONSOLIDATION AND RESTRUCTURING

The Parish Finance Council and all parishioners are most grateful to Bishop Danny and the Diocese of Monterey for their assistance in restructuring our debt obligations. The expenses related to the school operations and renovation, together with the elimination of all visitor admissions, had placed us in a precarious financial position. The Diocese helped the Mission restructure its debt in a manner that not only averted a potential crisis but will allow us to continue and grow the sacramental services that are so valuable to our community and visitors.

FORECOURT RENOVATION – CARMEL MISSION FOUNDATION

I hope you have all taken the time to visit and walk through the wonderful Basilica Forecourt and Downie Museum restoration. Once again, we are grateful for the extraordinary efforts of the Carmel Mission Foundation, their Executive Director, Stephanie Zelei, and their Board of Directors

PARISH MINISTRIES – RETURN TO SERVICE

Throughout the pandemic we have been fortunate to have the continued support of our many wonderful ministries. They, along with our staff, have had adapt to the changing conditions imposed by the pandemic, not just once or twice, but often.

Our liturgical ministers were, and continue to be, on the front lines as we were able to return to Mass in person with a variety of permutations. We were outdoors, indoors with distancing, indoors without distancing and a hybrid of indoors with the option of outdoor overflow, as we currently have. In addition, health and safety protocols must be understood and communicated with our parishioners and our many weekly visitors. We are grateful for their flexibility and commitment to service.

Our Choir was able to return to active participation at our Masses in June, and we are very excited for the return of Lessons and Carols this Christmas season.

Our Bereavement ministry has been able to return to their important work of supporting families in their time of greatest need. We have been conducting Funerals and Memorial Masses for those who passed away during the lockdown time of the pandemic as well as the recently deceased in our community.

Our Knights of Columbus made a triumphant return to their pancake breakfasts in November, and we look forward to more events with them in the New Year.

Docents are returning to kiosking this month and we are looking forward to their great contribution to our visitor experience.

As our ministries have been able to return to service, there has been one crucial structural change which is enabling us to serve the Mission, the ministries, and the broader community better than ever. All ministries now work closely and report to a specific Mission employee, who helps to coordinate their efforts against the backdrop of the many activities we support at the Mission daily. We look forward to continued collaboration and growth together.

This holiday season our Falge Farmworker Ministry takes center stage as our community joins to make the holiday a little brighter for our wonderful farmworkers who work so hard to put nourishing food on our tables. The farmworkers were hit particularly hard by the pandemic as they do not have the resources to stay home, protect themselves by social distancing or easy access to medical care.

While COVID precautions have changed the form of the assistance and gifts this ministry provides, they have never been more important. Every contribution will help to bring some joy to these members of our greater community.

COVID PROTOCOLS

We appreciate the continued cooperation and patience of our parishioners with the ever-changing recommendations from Monterey County. We are a special community that welcomes visitors to our sacred grounds from all over the world. We have been fortunate to provide the option of indoor and outdoor seating at our Masses.

We will continue to work diligently to ensure that Carmel Mission is a safe environment for all.

250th CELEBRATION

We have already had memorable celebrations commemorating the 250th anniversary of Saint Junipero's founding of our Mission.

On October 9th a celebration concert was held in the Mission Basilica. The event began with music from Monterey Strings Quartet. Featured singers, Tenor Pasquale Esposito and our own Laura Schwingel, brought the house down with their exquisite renditions of favorite songs. This is just one example of what will be more wonderful musical events at the Mission.

This event was followed the next afternoon by a Mass celebrated by Bishop Danny Garcia commemorating the 250th anniversary and Saint Junipero's contributions to our community and California. This was followed by a candlelight dinner and wine auction in the Central Courtyard. Everyone enjoyed a gourmet four course dinner served and enjoyed under the stars while bidding on unique bottles of wine. FORECOURT RENOVATION

Just over one week ago [from October 24th, 2021], the last remaining section of the construction fencing, which had been in place for many months, was taken down and brought to another site.

Lo and behold, an amazingly beautiful vista was revealed - our restored Basilica Forecourt and Downie Museum.

I invite you to spend some time there, when you get a chance. A favorite vantage point of mine, which offers an expansive view, is the new seating area that we have provided over near the wall at the corner of Lasuen and Rio roads. I have the advantage of being able to spend some time there in the evening, when no one else is there to disturb the serene peace that prevails.

The Downie Museum is unrecognizable, compared to its former shell. We have taken out the problematic restrooms and enabled people to move freely between the front and the rear sections of the building. Two new ADA restrooms have been added to the building.

As you enter the Downie Museum, you cannot help but notice, and hopefully admire, the beautiful stonework of the fireplace, which had been painted over many times. We had the chimney cleaned also, just in case the heating fails!

None of this work would have happened were it not for the financial support that we received from the Carmel Mission Foundation. I thank Stephanie Zelei and her Board of Directors for all the painstaking work that they put into this very worthwhile and successful project.

In order to welcome more visitors, pilgrims and parishioners to our restored Forecourt, we have added an extra gated entrance at the side of our Museum Store.

We continue to move "Always forward..." , with great hope in our hearts and an undiminished commitment to preserve and enhance our beautiful Carmel Mission for generations to come.

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

I hope and pray that you and your loved ones are safe and well, as we embark on our faith journey through this special year of 2021, during which we celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the founding of our beautiful Mission by Saint Junípero Serra.

This is a year of RECOVERY and RENEWAL, a time to celebrate our past achievements and to plan for our future. While it is obviously true that conditions and restrictions of 2020 impacted our parish, both materially and spiritually, we have not been idle. We have used the time wisely to explore new and innovative ways to keep our community together and to plan for our future.

Who could have predicted how important the timing of our 2020 AMA Heavenly Sounds Campaign would be? The console of our beautiful Casavant organ has been restored and updated by its original makers and is awaiting re-installation. We have invested in a superb outdoor sound system for our masses in our Central Courtyard. We have been broadcasting mass on our website and our YouTube channel, which has enabled us to gather as a virtual community, and which is of particular benefit to those parishioners who are unable to attend mass in person.

It is time to launch our 2021 AMA (Annual Ministry Appeal). Our diocese has chosen the theme "Building a Family of Faith". I enclose an AMA information leaflet which indicates the range of ministries that you support by participating in the campaign. The first \$52,000 raised goes back to the diocese, and any sum we raise over that sum, comes back to our parish for RECOVERY and RENEWAL during our 250th Anniversary year. At Carmel Mission, we have set a total goal of \$250,000. We will use the additional \$198,000 to increase our efforts at building up our virtual family of faith. We plan to enhance our filming and digital communication capabilities through the investment in state of the art equipment and upgrades to our wireless infrastructure.

With the addition of our new Central Courtyard Restrooms, currently under construction, and the renovation of the Downie Museum and Basilica Forecourt, planned for this Spring, we will also invest in improving safety and access to our beautiful Mission. We will also expand our Museum exhibition space, in order to attract and welcome more visitors and pilgrims, whose support we greatly appreciate and rely on. We will share our progress towards achieving our goals on a dedicated page on our website and our weekly bulletin. In each of the past three years, your generosity has enabled us to achieve our AMA goals: Upgrade of Crespi Parish Hall, Renew Our Pews, and Heavenly Sounds. We could not have done this without you. I thank you from the bottom of my heart.

During this 250th Anniversary year, I know that I can count on your selfless stewardship and your generous support of our beautiful Carmel Mission.
