FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

This Sunday we are fortunate to have our beloved Bishop, Danny Garcia, with us to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for thirteen young members of our community. At their Baptism, their parents chose for them to embark on a journey of faith in our Catholic Church. They have received Jesus in the Eucharist, further strengthening them for the journey, and this Sunday they will receive, in a special way, the gifts of the Holy Spirit. They are now choosing for themselves the faith they were raised in, and are asking God to continue to be with them, to guide and support them, as they enter adulthood and face the many decisions that lie before them.

The readings today speak to our young people as they welcome the Holy Spirit into their hearts, as they all involve God's call and our response. In the Gospel Jesus calls his first disciples, Simon (Peter), James and John. They had listened to Jesus' teaching on the shores of the Sea of Galilee, and Simon calls Jesus "Master" when he follows Jesus's instruction to put out their nets again, despite a complete lack of success earlier. When Peter returns with his boat heavily loaded with fish, he now calls Jesus "Lord" and is ready to follow Him and become a fisher of people.

Pope St. John Paul II wrote an apostolic letter in 2001 entitled *Novo Millennio Inuente* (At the Beginning of the New Millennium.) In it he reflected on this Gospel passage, writing, "Duc in Altum (Put Out Into the Deep)! These words ring out to us today, and they invite us to remember the past with gratitude, to live the present with enthusiasm, and look to the future with confidence: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Heb 13:18.)"

Please join me this week in praying for our newly confirmed, and that we may all be inspired to put out into the deep, and delve ever further into the magnificent mysteries of our faith.

Scripture Message

All three of the readings for this Sunday contain a story of a call: different people, in different circumstances, yet all are touched by the divine initiative. Isaiah, perhaps daydreaming, was in the Jerusalem temple; Paul, certainly persecuting, was on the road to Damascus; the fishermen, at the lake of Gennesaret (the Sea of Galilee), were washing their nets. Isaiah and Peter both initially profess unworthiness to answer God's call. The angel's purification of Isaiah's lips with a burning ember, and Jesus' encouragement of Peter ultimately give them the courage to say, "Here I am, send me!" Paul's letter to the people of Corinth reminds us again that Jesus is not a fairytale. He was an actual human being, who lived and died in the Middle East in a specific moment in history. Paul knows of at least 500 people who knew Jesus personally, whom Jesus appeared to, many of whom were still living in Paul's lifetime. Jesus appeared to Paul himself, transforming in an instant who he was, what he believed, and his mission in life. Peter and the other fishermen, after one encounter with Jesus leave everything to follow Him, becoming His disciples. Isaiah goes from saying he is doomed to embracing his call to be a prophet of the Lord. In all cases, God overcomes their fear, allowing them to become who He created them to be. How can we imagine God will do any less for us, if we let Him?



California Bishops Commit to Working for Better Futures for California's Women, Children, and Families

The approaching 49th anniversary of *Roe v. Wade* comes at a historic moment. The nation stands on the precipice of potentially overturning *Roe v. Wade*. At the same time, the Governor and state legislators have issued calls to make California a "sanctuary" destination for women seeking abortions from in and out of state.

However, asking to increase the number of abortions in California completely misses a vital, life-affirming point. - To advocate for transformative family policies, including increased access to affordable housing, prioritization of homeless pregnant and parenting women, expanded paid leave for families, dignified care for incarcerated pregnant and parenting women, and streamlined processes for families fostering and adopting infants and children.
- To empower our Catholic community to accompany the most vulnerable women, children, and families in our state, proclaiming the dignity of every human life through word and action.

Inspired by the love of the Triune God mirrored in the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, and animated by the ministry of Jesus to comfort, provide, heal and restore, we dedicate ourselves to this cause.





Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.



They look after your interests so very well.


My special thanks to Al Nicora, our Council Chair, for putting the following report together.


