FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Every Second Sunday of Lent we hear the Gospel story of the Transfiguration of the Lord. This year in our lectionary cycle, we hear Luke's account. Jesus, accompanied by three of His disciples goes up to the top of Mount Tabor to pray.. The disciples, exhausted by the climb, fall asleep and awake to find Jesus aglow and in conversation with two of the greatest Hebrew prophets, Moses and Elijah .We truly cannot imagine what must have gone through the disciples' minds. We see from their words and actions thus far that they love Jesus, they believe in Jesus, but they do not truly understand Jesus, His identity or His mission.

It might be easy to lose sight of the fact that, to the disciples, Jesus was very much a human being. We have the benefit of hindsight to know that Jesus died,, rose again from the dead, and is truly the Son of God. The disciples believed that Jesus was their Lord, but they could not possibly have had a full understanding of what that meant as they were living these events in real time. As such, they are left to react to Jesus in the moment, and they are left speechless by the events on the mountaintop.

We too would likely be left speechless to see our friend and teacher glowing with supernatural light and in conversation with long dead heroes. But Jesus's transfiguration is not a magic trick, it is a manifestation of His inner being, His inner glory. We long to be filled with that same light, and we have the same tool to access it, prayer. Jesus is transfigured, transformed, when he is at prayer, speaking to His Father from His heart. We may not be transfigured, but when we open our hearts to God in prayer, the opportunity to be transformed presents itself. This week I invite you to join in opening our hearts to God, seeking transformation.

I wish you and your loved ones Lenten blessings of good health and open hearts. Please continue to pray for peace and reconciliation in our wounded world,

Scripture Message

Luke describes Jesus's transfiguration as happening "while he was praying," emphasizing the power of prayer to mediate the presence of God and the consequent transformation of the one who prays. Jesus is joined by two of his ancestors, Moses and Elijah. The first of these, Moses, had to cope with his people who frequently grumbled about their exodus out of Egyptian slavery and into freedom. After spending forty days on Mount Sinai where God had called him to receive the divine teaching, Moses was transformed by his encounter and his face had become so radiant that when he came down from the mountain to his people, he needed to veil himself lest his brightness blind them (Exod 34:29-35). Elijah had encountered God in the silence outside the cave on Mount Horeb after his forty-day flight from Jezebel. (1 Kgs 18-19). The glory of the transfiguration eventually penetrates the disciples' sleep. Their slumber, as it will be at Gethsemane, is the opposite of prayerful attention. As Moses and Elijah leave, Peter suggests a more familiar solution, that they "house" the glory of Jesus, Moses, and Elijah in three tents set up on this mountain. As observant Jews, Jesus and the disciples would have all celebrated the feast of Tabernacles/Booths from their childhood. That feast commemorates not only the wilderness wandering of Israel when the people lived in fragile, portable tents, but also the later dwelling of the cloud of God's glory in the Jerusalem temple. God, however, has something else in mind and visits the mountaintop, again in cloud form, and proclaims Jesus His beloved Son.



SYNODAL CONSULTATIONS



Pope Francis wants to hear from the whole Church about what is happening in local parishes. He and the bishops would like to know what individuals think we should all be doing to help make our parishes better. The way he has proposed doing this is a synodal process. Synod means “journeying together” and it involves listening to the Holy Spirit and to each other in order to discern the path we are called to walk together.

The synod is intended to inspire people to dream about the church we are called to be, to make people’s hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts, and restore strength to our hands for our common mission.

The idea of synods is not something new; synods emerged from the early Church and the 2021 - 2023 synod process is not simply another program or a new initiative. Synodality is a way of being Church, not just an event or program.

When we gather at the parish level, our basic questions are:

“What are our experiences in the Church today?”

And

“What is the Holy Spirit saying to our Church today.”

St. Patrick's Day


According to the Confessio of Patrick, when he was about 16, he was captured by Irish pirates from his home in Great Britain, and taken as a slave to Ireland, looking after animals, where he lived for six years before escaping and returning to his family. After becoming a cleric, he returned to northern and western Ireland. In later life, he served as a bishop, but little is known about the places where he worked. By the seventh century, he had already come to be revered as the patron saint of Ireland. Saint Patrick's Day is observed on March 17, the supposed date of his death. It is celebrated inside and outside Ireland as a religious and cultural holiday.

Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.




