FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Today in the Gospel Jesus takes on one of the most prevalent misconceptions of His time, and perhaps of ours as well, that good things happen to good people and bad things to bad people. That there is a karmic balance, and when tragedy strikes, perhaps there is some kind of divine retribution involved. Jesus dispels this myth entirely. Accidents and tragedies, including those caused by the inhumanity of people to one another, are not a mark of God's judgement. They are however a reminder of the fragility of life and the need to be ready to meet our merciful God at any time.

The latter part of the Gospel reading reminds me of our Lenten theme, walking home to God. As we look back on our lives we can all clearly identify things we regret, sometimes saying, "if I knew then what I know now I would never have chosen that!" We see times when we strayed from the path home to God, the twist and turns that present themselves in all our lives. Thankfully, the prevailing aspect of God is mercy. God is the gardener at the end of the Gospel reading, granting a second, third, or tenth chance to every one of us. God knows that with cultivation and care we are all capable of bearing fruit.

God is not simply awaiting for us at our destination, waiting to see who makes it home and who does not. God is, whether we acknowledge or welcome Him or not, is walking beside us every step. God is gently showing us the path home, encouraging us to take even one step towards Him, and He will be there to meet us, to show us how to cultivate our soil and return to fruitfulness.. God loves each of us uniquely and is committed, as the psalmist says, to heal all our ills. It is never too late, or too soon, to get back on the road home to God.

I wish you and your loved ones Lenten blessings of good health, great hope, and new fruitfulness. Please join me in continuing to pray for peace,

Scripture Message

In the Gospel today Jesus challenges a belief that was very prevalent in His time, that bad things happen to bad people and good things happen to good people. "By no means!" says Jesus. The tragedies of the massacre of the Galileans and the people crushed by the collapse of the tower of Siloam were not examples of God's vengeance on the sinful. Indeed the victims were not more sinful than anyone else, they were the unfortunate victims of accident in the case of the tower, and man's inhumanity to man in the case of those killed by Pilate's henchmen. They do, however, show the fragility of life, and how quickly death can overwhelm us. As such, the time is now to make sure we are ready for the merciful, but just, judgment of God. And in case we are in doubt of the merciful nature of God proclaimed in the psalm, Jesus goes on to tell us the parable of the fig tree. The fig tree is a hardy tree, so for it to be barren meant years, not days, of neglect and malnourishment. But the gardener is not ready to give up, like our God of second chances, he believes that just one year of care, of cultivation and good nourishment will restore the tree, and return it to the balance the orchard owner desires, where what the tree takes from the soil helps it to be fruitful. How are you tending your inner fig tree this Lenten season, and preparing to bear fruit in the year ahead?



Pope Francis wants to hear from the whole Church about what is happening in local parishes. He and the bishops would like to know what individuals think we should all be doing to help make our parishes better. The way he has proposed doing this is a synodal process. Synod means “journeying together” and it involves listening to the Holy Spirit and to each other in order to discern the path we are called to walk together.

The synod is intended to inspire people to dream about the church we are called to be, to make people’s hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts, and restore strength to our hands for our common mission.

The idea of synods is not something new; synods emerged from the early Church and the 2021 - 2023 synod process is not simply another program or a new initiative. Synodality is a way of being Church, not just an event or program.

When we gather at the parish level, our basic questions are:

“What are our experiences in the Church today?”

And

“What is the Holy Spirit saying to our Church today.”



Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.




