FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Our Scripture readings for this Easter Sunday focus on the importance of witness. In the Gospel, Mary Magdalene, Peter, and John are witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus, though they do not yet truly understand the implications of what has occurred. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter, having received the inspiration, wisdom, and understanding of the Holy Spirit, is reminding the early faithful that they are witnesses to Jesus' life, death and resurrection. They are called to share that witness, to "preach to the people and testify that that He is the one appointed by God." (Acts 10:42)

Many generations have passed since the actual eye witnesses to Jesus' life walked the earth, but we too are called to bear witness to Jesus' resurrection. While we did not see the empty tomb with our own eyes, our faith, and our personal relationship with our loving God, calls us to the testify to the fact that God did indeed so love the world that He sent His only Son to die for the salvation of humankind, and then to triumph over death forever.

Though we were not eye witnesses to the Resurrection, we are eye witnesses in the world today, and with that comes the same responsibility and privilege of the first Christians. Our hearts and minds are with the Ukrainian people, as they continue to suffer the atrocities of this senseless war. Sadly, that is only one of far too many areas of conflict in the world. We are responsible to bear witness to their suffering, as well as their courage, and continue to demand an end to war and violence, and pray for a prevailing peace.

We also have the privilege to bear witness to one another's lives. At the Chrism Mass on Tuesday, Bishop Danny spoke movingly and emotionally about what it meant to him to be able to gather again as the Church of Monterey, something that has not been possible, or, at best, very limited, in the past two years. When we bear witness to our brothers and sisters we can amplify their joy and help to lift the heaviness of sadness, and they in turn do the same for us.

I wish you and your loved ones Easter blessings of good health, new hope, and great joy in the Risen Christ,

Scripture Message

In the Gospel of John today we find Mary Magdalene approaching the tomb early in the morning to attend the body of Jesus. She is horrified to find no body there at all, fearing that grave robbers, or worse, Jesus' enemies planning further desecrations, have stolen the body of her Lord. She runs back to the disciples, who have been mourning the loss of their teacher and friend, fearing that they will be next in line for execution, and grappling with the shame of their cowardice in the face of Jesus' heroic act of love. Two disciples, Peter and John, run to the tomb, and are confronted with the traumatic scene. Neither understand what has happened, but despite not understanding John believes. He believes that this is not a desecration or a robbery but an act of God. The telling of this story is rich in detail, some seemingly superfluous to the story, who runs faster, who goes in the tomb first, exactly how the burial clothes are arranged. These details provide credibility and grounding to John's resurrection account as they are specific details recounted by eye-witnesses. The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles also emphasizes this notion of witness. Peter proclaims, "We are witnesses of all that he did." How do you bear witness to the death and resurrection of Jesus in your daily life?





The **Altar Society** provides care and upkeep for the altar linens and supports additional needs of the altar.

The **Carmel Mission Bereavement Ministry** provides caring consolation and spiritual support to parish families who are grieving the death of a loved one.

The **Bible Study** holds weekly meetings to study and discuss various books of the Bible.

The **Book Club** holds weekly meetings to read and discuss selected books.

The **Carmel Mission Docent Ministry** provides historical stewardship for the Mission and its art and artifacts. The Docents provide a welcoming presence and historical information to our many visitors.

Eucharistic Adoration is a special devotion whereby worshipers dedicate their time to be present with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to honor, adore and pray to Him.

The **Faith Formation Ministry** provides religious education for the faithful of all ages.

The **False Farmworkers Program Ministry** procure and distribute food and clothing to farmworkers and their families, who are in need.

The **Homebound Eucharistic Ministry** practices the Corporal works of mercy. Members visit and comfort the sick and the elderly, and bring Communion to those who have difficulty attending Mass.

The **Women's & Men's I-HELP** (Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program) activities at Carmel Mission are one of the many Monterey Peninsula churches, faith communities, or service organizations that provide overnight accommodation, a nutritious hot meal, and a caring community to homeless men and women one evening a month.

The **Knights of Columbus** were founded in 1882 on the principles of charity, unity and fraternity. The Carmel Mission, Council 4593, Knights of Columbus, provides hospitality and fundraising support to our parish community.

The **Liturgical Ministry** supports all aspects of our parish liturgy.

The **Carmel Mission Basilica Schola Cantorum** is a traditional choral ensemble which assists with the music leadership every week at our 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. The repertoire of the group is drawn from the works of both contemporary and traditional Catholic composers.

FRENCH DOUBLE CONFESSIONAL

Confessional located in Our Lady of Bethlehem Chapel

Carmel Mission received a generous donation from a family who wanted to find the right home for this unique/exquisite work of craftsmanship. This beautiful confessional fits in perfectly in this setting, as if it has been here for years.

Below is the history we were provided about the piece...



When an earthquake hit the south of France in the 1990's, a small village church crumbled. The church had decided not to try to rebuild, and in order to raise money to help the village recover, the church was selling whatever items it could salvage.

The collapse of the church roof damaged the door and the cross on the chapiteau, and the aged chene (oak) was cloaked in stone dust.

Gentle restoration experts repaired the damage, cleaned and waxed all surfaces many times with lavender beeswax.

The inscription above the door reads "M . le 2eme Vicaire" (second vicar, assistant to the curate)

Now Featuring Pieta


"The word Pietà finds its origins in the Italian word for "pity" and the Latin word for "piety", giving it a sense of "compassion" and "devotion". From the depiction of Mary and her dead son in her lap, the compassion of the mother is quite obvious. Besides that, the Pietà is also a sign that even after the death of Jesus, his followers would never fall short of devotion for him."



Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.



They look after your interests so very well.


My special thanks to Al Nicora, our Council Chair, for putting the following report together.


