FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Throughout the Easter season we hear readings from the Acts of the Apostles. Written as a kind of sequel to Luke's Gospel, the Acts answer many of the questions posed by the Gospel. Today we learn what the disciples did after Jesus comes back. Filled with the Holy Spirit, given to them in the Gospel we read today, they perform many signs and wonders. They begin to develop a level of celebrity, though people still fear to join them openly.

Imagine you are a resident of first century Jerusalem. You had likely heard of the teacher from Nazareth, Jesus, who attracted quite a following but whose life ended in spectacular cruelty on Calvary. Now, his followers are preaching His Resurrection, performing signs and miracles of healing. Whatever you made of His message, Jesus' crucifixion certainly gives you pause to join the ranks of His followers, you have no desire to be a target for the religious or civil authorities. But His disciples are preaching fearlessly. Perhaps, despite your reservations, you bring a loved one to His disciples and they are miraculously healed in His Name. How would you react to a miracle on earth? Would you be ready to acknowledge that the Lord is operating in ways you have not been taught or have not considered before?

The power of the Holy Spirit enabled Jesus' first disciples, people with no great qualifications, whose cowardly behavior at the time of Jesus' Passion and Death did them no credit, to be the agents of remarkable change. That same power is alive and active in our world today. We may be equally unlikely and unworthy vessels but the Holy Spirit may also call us to effect change through our witness to the truth of the Gospel. In a similar vein, we may encounter God in places or manners or persons we do not expect. God may surprise us both in how we are called to preach the Good News, and who is preaching the Good News to us.

I wish you and your loved ones Easter blessings of good health and great joy. As war continues to rage in our world, please pray for peace and healing,

Scripture Message

Today's Gospel finds the disciples in a state of complete despair. They are fearful on many fronts. For one, they fear the Jews who put Jesus to death, they are terrified that they will be next up for crucifixion, in the hopes of stamping out Jesus' legacy. They are grappling with their own betrayal and abandonment of Jesus. They are ashamed, and though they do not understand the mystery that Jesus has risen from the dead, those who believe the women's account fear what it might mean for them, His faithless followers, if Jesus IS indeed risen. Enter Jesus, not with fanfare and trumpets, He just appears among his friends, and gives them the greatest possible gift, peace. He does not need to offer forgiveness or explanations or to hear their excuses and apologies, He moves on past all of this by offering them His peace. He keeps moving forward by giving them the Holy Spirit and commissioning them for the work of spreading the Good News of the Gospel. Thomas misses out on this initial encounter. Like his companions who did not accept the testimony of Mary Magdalene about Jesus's resurrection, Thomas also wants a personal experience. In both his disbelief and his faith, Thomas represents us, the future generations who are called to blessedness because we believe without having seen Jesus in the flesh. Jesus invites Thomas to touch the wounds in his risen body, for in this wounded body is the way, the truth, and the life that Thomas was seeking (John 14:5-7). It is Thomas's faith, not his hands, that digs deeply into the mystery of his risen Lord, and he cries out the most profound and personal proclamation of faith: "My Lord and my God!" In return, Jesus speaks the greatest of all beatitudes that will resound beyond that Jerusalem room, into our assembly today, and to the end of the age: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."



We will have an attendant at each entrance.


Please note that the courtyards are an extension of our Mass. We ask that everyone be aware and respect the prayerful environment of this setting.

FRENCH DOUBLE CONFESSIONAL

Confessional located in Our Lady of Bethlehem Chapel

Carmel Mission received a generous donation from a family who wanted to find the right home for this unique/exquisite work of craftsmanship. This beautiful confessional fits in perfectly in this setting, as if it has been here for years.

Below is the history we were provided about the piece...



When an earthquake hit the south of France in the 1990's, a small village church crumbled. The church had decided not to try to rebuild, and in order to raise money to help the village recover, the church was selling whatever items it could salvage.

The collapse of the church roof damaged the door and the cross on the chapiteau, and the aged chene (oak) was cloaked in stone dust.

Gentle restoration experts repaired the damage, cleaned and waxed all surfaces many times with lavender beeswax.

The inscription above the door reads "M . le 2eme Vicaire" (second vicar, assistant to the curate)


Over the past several years, we have cataloged, conserved and stored many donated objects in our collection.



Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.




