FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

In the Gospel reading today we have the beautiful image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd, "My sheep hear my voice: I know them, and they follow me" (John 10:27). This pastoral image was particularly relevant to the people of Jesus' time, many of whom were shepherds themselves, and all of whom were likely familiar with an agrarian lifestyle. It is perhaps less personally potent for most of us today, though here at Carmel Mission we do have our beloved Mission Ranch sheep to inspire us! It remains one of the most beloved ways that we think about Jesus and our relationship to Him. I think its popularity lies in part in what Jesus says only a few sentences later, "No one can take them out of my hand." (John 10: 29) The relationship of the sheep and the shepherd evokes intimacy, care, and protection.

In Jesus' time it was common for shepherds to band together at night, gathering their flocks into large groups numbering over 5000 sheep. In this way, they could share the night watch and still get some sleep, guarding the flock in shifts. In the morning the shepherds would call to their sheep with their unique voice and the sheep would extricate themselves from the large group and follow their respective shepherds to the day's grazing areas. They never had to worry about the sheep getting into the wrong flock because the sheep themselves knew the shepherd's call, the shepherd knew the sheep so personally that he would immediately notice if one was missing. This is something we all crave, to know and be known intimately. It underpins the fidelity of couples and the steadfastness of friends, and these human relationships are a mere glimpse of the incredibly intimate love of our Creator, who loved us in our mother's womb.

This brings us to another relationship we celebrate this Mother's Day. The relationship of mothers and their children of any age is a reflection of the perfect, unconditional love of God. Jesus Himself knew the love of a mother, who risked everything to bring Him into the world, raised Him, loved Him, followed Him, and accompanied Him to Calvary to suffer with Him. Today we honor that fierce immeasurable love, and its important place in our lives, in whatever form it takes.

I wish you and your loved ones Easter blessings of good health and new hope. Please join in praying for all mothers, and for peace in our war-torn world,

Scripture Message

This week's first reading from Acts continues the story of Peter, Paul, Barnabas and the other disciples boldly proclaiming the works of Jesus. They have gained a lot of followers who were not born Jewish, the Gentiles. In order to follow Paul and Barnabas, they have converted to Judaism. Later it will be decided that one does not need to convert to Judaism to be a Christian, but this was probably a few months to years after the death of Jesus, and Christianity is in its infancy. This, understandably, bothers those born Jewish. Not only is this religious minority accustomed to being left alone, this influx of Jewish converts are following the suspicious upstarts who had followed Jesus. Paul and Barnabas are challenging the existing way of doing things and blatantly rebuking the religious standards of the day. They see that there are certain members of their community who are not interested in the message of Jesus, because they fear it threatens their precariously balanced freedom under Roman rule. Jesus was not the Messiah they had hoped for, one who would liberate them from civil oppression. The freedom Jesus offers is much greater but they are comfortable, and any threat to their comfort is suspect. The actual freedom being preached by Jesus' followers can be found in the image of the Good Shepherd in the Gospel. Jesus offers intimacy, protection and care, not just now, but for eternal life. Nothing can separate those who follow the Shepherd's voice from the overwhelming love of the Trinity. The Psalmist reminds us that we are God's people, the flock He guides, loves and protects, and this is cause for great joy.

We will have an attendant at each entrance.


Please note that the courtyards are an extension of our Mass. We ask that everyone be aware and respect the prayerful environment of this setting.



Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.




