# FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Today we celebrate the great mystery at the heart of our Catholic faith, the Most Holy Trinity, one God in three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Our typical understanding of the word mystery is something that is meant to be solved, but the theological sense of mystery is a little different. Rather than something to be solved, Christian mystery is something that is infinitely knowable. Instead of having one finite answer, the mysteries of our faith are mysterious in the sense that however much we learn, there is still much more for us to know.

The possibilities of this understanding of mystery are exhilarating, our God is endlessly revealing Himself to us. No matter how much time we spend in prayer or theological study, there will always be opportunity for more. Exhilarating, but, if you are a little like me and generally prefer answers to mystery, sometimes a bit frustrating. When I was a young priest I used to think that when I arrived at my heavenly home, God willing, I would have so many questions for God, and finally I would have answers! Now I believe that there will be no need for questions or answers, because part of the perfection of heaven is that we will finally understand as God does, and both questions and their answers will be irrelevant.

Until then, we ponder the mystery of the Trinity with open hearts and curious minds. The first reading from the Book of Proverbs this weekend helps us to understand a little better the relationship of the Trinity. The Spirit of God was present at Creation, "then was I beside him as his craftsman, and I was his delight day by day, playing before him all the while, playing on the surface of his earth; and I found delight in the human race." (Proverbs 8:31) What a beautiful scene! The Spirit cavorting on the face of the earth, playing and taking delight in creation. At the very formation of our world, the Trinity was present, and our loving, playful, forgiving, triune God is with us today in the same way, taking care of and delight in God's creation.

I wish you and your loved one blessings of good health and new hope. Please continue to pray for peace and healing,

## Scripture Message

Our first reading from Proverbs can be read as a monologue from the Holy Spirit. Within the constructs of temporality and linear history, the notion of one God in three persons is very confusing and has proven to be one of the most frustrating aspects of our faith throughout Christian history. This passage offers those of us confined to linear time a poetic understanding of the Holy Spirit at the creation of the world. "The Lord possessed me, the beginning of his ways, the forerunner of his prodigies of long ago; from of old I was poured forth, at the first, before the earth." Because of the lack of a physical image, it's harder to explain the Holy Spirit in satisfying terms when contemplating the Trinity. We know that the Holy Spirit is a person sent to us by God, after the ministry and resurrection of Jesus. We know the Holy Spirit continues to facilitate the active work of our Lord on earth today. This week, we have the opportunity to read about the Holy Spirit as wisdom. We might read these words as if they are the biography of the Holy Spirit, who has always existed as a person of the Trinity, with God, "beside him as his craftsman, and I was his delight day by day, playing before him all the while, playing on the surface of his earth; and I found delight in the human race" The Holy Spirit interacts with us in a different way than Jesus. Jesus lived a full life as a human and is present to us fully in the Eucharist. The Holy Spirit "will take from what is mine [Jesus's] and declare it to you." The Holy Spirit brings out those parts of us that are oriented toward God, and showers us with grace. The Holy Spirit brings out the intrinsic possibility for salvation that we all have, as heirs of the resurrection of Christ. As an active person of the triune God, the Holy Spirit weaves through our hearts and thoughts, drawing us toward actions that follow Jesus's message and spread love and goodness. The Holy Spirit is a person with agency, who is available for us to call upon at every moment, as one of the three persons of God.


We will have an attendant at each entrance.

Book Club meets on Fridays at 1:30 pm via ZOOM


The Book Club has begun reading a new selection, **Beyond: How Humankind Thinks About Heaven** by *Catherine Wolff*.

The **Carmel Mission Docent Ministry** provides historical stewardship for the Mission and its art and artifacts. The Docents provide a welcoming presence and historical information to our many visitors.

**Eucharistic Adoration** is a special devotion whereby worshipers dedicate their time to be present with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to honor, adore and pray to Him.

The **Faith Formation Ministry** provides religious education for the faithful of all ages.

The **False Farmworkers Program Ministry** procures and distributes food and clothing to farmworkers and their families, who are in need.

The **Homebound Eucharistic Ministry** practices the Corporal works of mercy. Members visit and comfort the sick and the elderly, and bring Communion to those who have difficulty attending Mass.

The **Women's & Men's I-HELP** (Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program) activities at Carmel Mission are one of the many Monterey Peninsula churches, faith communities, or service organizations that provide overnight accommodation, a nutritious hot meal, and a caring community to homeless men and women one evening a month.

The **Knights of Columbus** were founded in 1882 on the principles of charity, unity and fraternity. The Carmel Mission, Council 4593, Knights of Columbus, provides hospitality and fundraising support to our parish community.

The **Liturgical Ministry** supports all aspects of our parish liturgy.

The **Carmel Mission Basilica Schola Cantorum** is a traditional choral ensemble which assists with the music leadership every week at our 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. The repertoire of the group is drawn from the works of both contemporary and traditional Catholic composers.



Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.




