# FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

How many times have you prayed the Lord's Prayer? Over a lifetime it is surely too many times to count. The first disciples were sometimes slow to understand Jesus' teaching, but in this instance they are completely accurate in their observations and their request. They have seen Jesus pray, not once, but often. They have seen prayer restore and strengthen Him. They want to know how to pray as He does. And Jesus obliges, encouraging us all to pray to His Father as our own Father. The loving relationship Jesus has with His Father is available to all of us as children of God. This was a radical idea at the time, but it now shapes the very heart of our understanding of God.

Since May 2020 our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has regularly used his weekly Wednesday audiences to teach us about prayer. Transcripts of his brief talks are available online on the Vatican's website, and I find them to be inspiring reflections that open my eyes to new and beautiful ideas about prayer. In his catechesis on April 21, 2021, "The Vocal Prayer" Pope Francis discusses the Lord's prayer specifically. We may feel that God knows our needs, likely better than we do, so there is no reason that we need to tell God what we want and need. However, Pope Francis says coming to God with our pleas helps to build trust and hope in our hearts. The Our Father includes four petitions for our own personal needs: give us our daily bread; forgive us our trespasses; lead us not into temptation; and deliver us from evil. Pope Francis promises, "Everything is there, in that prayer. It is a prayer we should say often."

The Lord's Prayer is also a truly ecumenical prayer. Not only a treasure of our Catholic faith, it is beloved across many Christian denominations, making it a prayer we can pray together with our brothers and sisters from other faith traditions. In our increasingly divided and divisive world, the prayer of Jesus' heart has the power to draw us together in new unity.

I wish you and your loved ones blessings of good health, great hope, and answered prayers.

## Scripture Message

Why do we pray? It is not to impose our will on God, but to ask God to make us available His will, to share our concerns with God, and to place these under God's loving judgment. It is, therefore, not an effort to change God, but to change ourselves. Of all the evangelists, Luke speaks most about prayer. His Gospel begins (1:10) and ends (24:53) in the context of prayer. At significant moments in his life, Jesus prays, and his example leads the disciples to ask him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples" (11:1). The Lukan version of Jesus's response expresses the deepest reality of Jesus's relationship with his God, into which he wants his disciples to be drawn. Our familiarity with the Lord's Prayer may dull our appreciation of its radical teaching about prayer. It is to be the prayer of a community that is conscious both of its intimate relationship with God and its presence in and responsibility for the world. In both testaments, God is "Father," a metaphor vastly different from that of the powerful Roman emperor, the "father of the homeland," or the authoritarian father of the family social unit. Especially in the Gospels, God is the Abba of Jesus, in loving, faithful, and intimate relationship with the Beloved Son. The kingdom for which disciples pray is not a kingdom of political power, but one that belongs to the poor, the liberated, the excluded, and forgiven sinners. That we may be changed, we pray for bread, forgiveness, and deliverance. We also need to be nourished with one another's forgiveness, because God will never starve us of forgiveness, and God's behavior must be the norm for His sons and daughters. To live in this way will save us at the time of "the final test." Jesus affirms what should be the quality of our prayer by telling two parables. What is described in the parable of the Friend at Midnight concerns three friends: the one who arrives unexpectedly, the host, and the one to whom the latter goes to ask for bread because he has run out of his own supply. If we are in an enduring relationship as prayerful "friends" with God, we can be assured that God will be hospitable to us in our need.



The **Altar Society** provides care and upkeep for the altar linens and supports additional needs of the altar.

The **Carmel Mission Bereavement Ministry** provides caring consolation and spiritual support to parish families who are grieving the death of a loved one.

The **Bible Study** holds weekly meetings to study and discuss various books of the Bible.

The **Book Club** holds weekly meetings to read and discuss selected books.

The **Carmel Mission Docent Ministry** provides historical stewardship for the Mission and its art and artifacts. The Docents provide a welcoming presence and historical information to our many visitors.

**Eucharistic Adoration** is a special devotion whereby worshipers dedicate their time to be present with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to honor, adore and pray to Him.

The **Faith Formation Ministry** provides religious education for the faithful of all ages.

The **False Farmworkers Program Ministry** procures and distributes food and clothing to farmworkers and their families, who are in need.

The **Homebound Eucharistic Ministry** practices the Corporal works of mercy. Members visit and comfort the sick and the elderly, and bring Communion to those who have difficulty attending Mass.

The **Women's & Men's I-HELP** (Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program) activities at Carmel Mission are one of the many Monterey Peninsula churches, faith communities, or service organizations that provide overnight accommodation, a nutritious hot meal, and a caring community to homeless men and women one evening a month.

The **Knights of Columbus** were founded in 1882 on the principles of charity, unity and fraternity. The Carmel Mission, Council 4593, Knights of Columbus, provides hospitality and fundraising support to our parish community.

The **Liturgical Ministry** supports all aspects of our parish liturgy.

The **Carmel Mission Basilica Schola Cantorum** is a traditional choral ensemble which assists with the music leadership every week at our 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. The repertoire of the group is drawn from the works of both contemporary and traditional Catholic composers.

## *Milagros*



"Milagros are small metal religious charms found in many areas of Latin America. The word "Milagros" means "miracles". These small charms, often depicting arms, legs, praying people, animals and a wide range of other subjects are typically nailed to crosses or wooden statues. The use of Milagros is connected with an institution known as "manda". This is where a person will ask for a favor from a Saint. A heart might represent ideas as diverse as a heart condition, a romance, or any number of interpretations. Milagros are also carried for protection and good luck."







Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.




