# FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

As is often the case, in order to better understand today's Gospel, it helps to know something about life in Jesus's day. When Jesus says, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough," we might think of Jesus putting some sort of restriction on our relationship with Him and the ultimate entrance into heaven. While it may be a foreign concept to us, this image of the narrow gate would have been well-known by Jesus's followers. Traditional city gates at the time typically had one large, central entrance arch and two smaller entrances off to each side. Caravans of goods and livestock and camels used the main entryway, but travelers without a cart or baggage could avoid this main line and enter through the narrow side gates. With the context of this image, we can recognize that Jesus is not the one who limits who will be saved. We know that, through Jesus, salvation is offered to all. We also know that not everyone will accept this invitation. Our own baggage will determine whether or not we can enter the narrow gate.

It is significant that in the same Gospel passage Jesus says, "People will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God." All are welcome in God's Kingdom. We encounter this theme throughout Luke's narrative, as we constantly see Jesus reaching out to people whom society might typically reject. Jesus upholds and welcomes relationship with women and tax collectors and those who are deemed "unclean." Indeed, the last are first and the first are last. But what about those of us in the middle? We are encouraged to enter through the narrow gate, to shed the baggage – our prejudices, our possessions, our status, whatever is weighing us down. It is never too late to lighten our load on our journey home to God, and ensure that we will fit through that narrow gate.

I wish you and your loved ones blessings of good health and great hope. Please continue to pray for peace in our world,

## Scripture Message

In this Gospel reading Jesus lays out one reality of the kingdom of God: not everyone will make it. This feels counterintuitive—that the same Jesus who goes in search of a lost sheep, and embraces the Prodigal Son, will tell evildoers to depart. However, there is a satisfaction in the agency we are granted in this week's gospel. We have the choice within our own hearts, and exemplified by our actions, to love others as Christ loves us, or to not. "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." It is easy to desire to do good. It is far more challenging to put it into practice. In the second reading, Paul explains the benefits of discipline. This pairs well with the message of the gospel, in that we are called to push ourselves and, frequently, to act in ways that are not easy. "At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it." Following Jesus is work. It is counterintuitive, calls us to put others before ourselves, and is frequently in conflict with the messages told to us by the secular world. It requires discipline and being uncomfortable. "So strengthen your drooping hands and your weak knees. Make straight paths for your feet, that what is lame may not be disjointed but healed." If you want to follow Christ, you have to put yourself in the position to succeed. If we want to be better at loving God and others, we have to practice. Alongside readings exhorting the benefits of discipline, we get a psalm that tells us to go out and tell the Good News. It is through telling the Good News that we practice discipline. When we are living a life that glorifies the Lord, we are putting into practice the work that Paul tells us to do to strengthen our hands and knees.

### 11:00 am Outdoor Mass





mouth of what is now Carmel Valley, a spot he described as "a locality indeed most delightful and suitable because of the extreme and excellent quality of the land and the water supply necessary for abundant harvests." Serra ultimately founded nine missions, but this remained his headquarters and favorite. He is buried here.

### A LITTLE CARMEL HISTORY

By 1835, Carmel, like the other missions, was secularized and its extensive land holdings divided among several large ranchos, pieces of which ultimately formed Carmel-by-the-Sea. The mission buildings slowly fell to ruin and weren't fully restored until Harry Downie began a meticulous restoration in 1931.

The Carmel Development Company sent out its first brochure in May of 1903 addressed "To the School teachers of California and other


workers at in-door employment." It promoted the town on Carmel Beach in the pine forest of the Carmel Mission." The sales were slow the first year, but soon grew as people from Stanford and the University of California bought lots and build small cabins in the woods. The earthquake of 1906 brought refugees from San Francisco, many of them artists and writers, drawn by the beauty and affordable prices.

Enticed by enthusiastic reports of Carmel's charms and affordable lifestyle, a number of these free spirits moved to the village where they became known as the "Bohemians." George and Carrie Sterling formed the center of a loosely structured group of friends that included among its members Mary Austin, Jack London, James Hopper, Herbert Heron and Sinclair Lewis. The Bohemians often gathered at the beach for abalone feasts, fine conversation and libations.

Vigilant stewardship has preserved the incomparable natural setting of coastline and beach. Trees are a vital element of the village landscape and citizens hold dear Carmel's history and sense of community. Residents treasure their village. They have resisted change and worked to protect the legacy left by earlier citizens.




## Carmel Mission Bible Study

## Carmel Mission Book Club


Book Club meets every Friday in Crespi Hall at 1:30 pm





Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.




