

FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Today's Gospel begins with a well-known parable in which Jesus advises the wedding guest to downplay their own importance so that the host has the opportunity to elevate them. He cautions them against putting themselves in the awkward and possibly humiliating position of being asked to move down the table to accommodate someone more important - good advice in a wide range of situations!

Human society is incredibly transactional. Most human interaction, and certainly most casual social interaction between people has something of a transactional nature. Even with our families and among our close friends, expectation can creep in to what we hope are unconditional relationships. This is the complete opposite of God's nature, and of what we can expect in God's Kingdom. God does not need or demand anything of us in exchange for His overwhelming love and the great gift of salvation. These are available to all of us, whether or not we accept God's generous invitation. This is good news for us, because we could never repay God for His generosity, and we have nothing to offer that could possibly compare. When Jesus encourages us to invite the poor, the crippled, the blind, and the lame to our banquet table it is not so that we can curry favor with God for our own generosity, but rather so that we can come to a deeper understanding of God by imitating how God engages with His creation.

Think of a time you experienced someone's completely unexpected generosity. I recently had such a moment when I was out and about early in the morning, not having the best day, waiting in line for a coffee when the person in front of me offered to buy everyone's drink of choice. I could have easily bought my own coffee, but this act of generosity from a complete stranger brightened my day. It was a good reminder that when we have the opportunity to be the generous host we should seize it. Not only does it bring us closer to God but it also helps us catch a glimpse of what awaits us in God's Kingdom.

Scripture Message

The first reading from Sirach lays down blunt and beautiful words on what it means to be humble. Someone who is humble is "loved more than a giver of gifts." This is an odd thing to say because one would assume that everyone wants to be around a gift giver. But are you more interested in the company of someone who basks in his or her own greatness, even if it comes with perks, or would you rather spend time with someone who downplays his or her accomplishments and greets you with interest and authenticity? This week's psalm beautifully details all the ways in which God rights the wrong of the world. "The father of orphans and the defender of widows / is God in his holy dwelling. / God gives a home to the forsaken; / he leads forth prisoners to prosperity." In these words, God places the last first. This gospel opens with a well-known parable about the last being first. The second half has a message not for the guests, but for the host. "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment." Jesus is describing an invitation that is transactional. It isn't a gift, because it comes with an expectation. Instead, Jesus proposes inviting those who cannot repay the host for such a meal. If the host were to "invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind," it would be a meal gifted out of love, not expectation. Christ's invitation to humility and vulnerability is grounded in self-knowledge. This concept is so difficult to grasp because it seems to go against everything within us. Rather than climbing up the ladder of power and prestige, wealth and success, Christ invites us to descend, to lower ourselves, to understand and welcome our own weakness and wounds. Instead of exalting ourselves, Christ invites us to follow his example and humble ourselves.

11:00 am Outdoor Mass







Carmel Mission Basilica is now advertised in the Guide to Carmel

a Franciscan friar whose task was the creation of a chain of missions along the coast of Alta California. In 1771, Serra located Mission San Carlos de Borromeo de Carmelo at the mouth of what is now Carmel Valley, a spot he described as "a locality indeed most delightful and suitable because of the extreme and excellent quality of the land and the water supply necessary for abundant harvests." Serra ultimately founded nine missions, but this remained his headquarters and favorite. He is buried here.

A LITTLE CARMEL HISTORY

By 1835, Carmel, like the other missions, was secularized and its extensive land holdings divided among several large ranchos, pieces of which ultimately formed Carmel-by-the-Sea. The mission buildings slowly fell to ruin and weren't fully restored until Harry Downie began a meticulous restoration in 1931.

The Carmel Development Company sent out its first brochure in May of 1903 addressed "To the School teachers of California and other

at in-door employment." It promoted Carmel on Carmel Beach in the pine forest Carmel Mission."


slow the first year, but soon professors from Stanford and the University of California began to buy lots and build small cabins in the woods. The earthquake of 1906 brought refugees from San Francisco, many of them artists and writers, drawn by the beauty and affordable prices.

Enticed by enthusiastic reports of Carmel's charms and affordable lifestyle, a number of these free spirits moved to the village where they became known as the "Bohemians." George and Carrie Sterling formed the center of a loosely structured group of friends that included among its members Mary Austin, Jack London, James Hopper, Herbert Heron and Sinclair Lewis. The Bohemians often gathered at the beach for abalone feasts, fine conversation and libations.

Vigilant stewardship has preserved the incomparable natural setting of coastline and beach. Trees are a vital element of the village landscape and citizens hold dear Carmel's history and sense of community. Residents treasure their village. They have resisted change and worked to protect the legacy left by earlier citizens.



Carmel Mission Book Club


Book Club meets every Friday in Crespi Hall at 1:30 pm



Our Advent theme, I Am For You, reminds us that our loving God is always on our side, despite any difficulties that we may have to encounter.




