FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

In an address to the United Nations on September 25, 2020, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, wrote, "We are faced, then, with a choice between two possible paths. One path leads to the consolidation of multilateralism as the expression of a renewed sense of global co-responsibility, a solidarity grounded in justice and the attainment of peace and unity within the human family, which is God's plan for our world. The other path emphasizes self- sufficiency, nationalism, protectionism, individualism and isolation; it excludes the poor, the vulnerable and those dwelling on the peripheries of life. That path would certainly be detrimental to the whole community, causing self-inflicted wounds on everyone. It must not prevail."

Today's parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man invites us to consider these words of Pope Francis. How do we reconcile the fact that while some people live in extravagance, others are struggling to eat? Throughout the Gospels, Jesus does not necessarily condemn people who are wealthy simply for having wealth. Rather, as we have seen in the readings for the past several Sundays, Jesus denounces people who have an excess of resources that they are unwilling to share with others. I believe it is important to remember that wealth is not only counted in dollars and cents. We are encouraged to share our time, our energy, our care, and our respect as well as our material wealth.

The Rich Man missed the opportunity to engage in a relationship with Lazarus, ultimately to his detriment and regret. Within our parish community we have two ministries that provide us with a wonderful example and an opportunity to engage in sharing of ourselves with those less fortunate. Both our Falge Farmworker Program and our parish participation in I-Help allow us to share not only our financial wealth, but also those more intangible but equally important resources. All our volunteers in these exceptional ministries are an inspiration to me and our entire parish family.

I wish you and your loved ones blessings of good health and great hope. Please continue to pray for peace,

Scripture Message

This week's gospel continues with variations on a theme of poverty above riches. The story of Lazarus is a simple dichotomy: the rich man has separated himself from love and reaps the result, and the poor man receives the mercy of God upon death. The twist here is that the rich man realizes his mistake and, in an act of selflessness that's too late, asks to warn his family, so they might not come to his fate. But God points out the obvious: "If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead." This may feel unfair. The rich man has repented—why not allow him to warn his brothers? But Jesus reminds us that we have received warnings and road signs for life over and over through the prophets and through his own ministry. In the psalm today, the Lord "sets captives free" and "raises up those who were bowed down." We see that happen for Lazarus, who is freed from his life of poverty and illness. This continues the theme from last week, placing value and success outside the realm of material comfort. Paul's letter to Timothy contains an interesting line: "Compete well for the faith." Compete? Against what? Against whom? "I charge you before God . . . to keep the commandment without stain or reproach." The competition is between Timothy and himself. Paul is challenging Timothy to remain faithful against all odds. "Lay hold of eternal life, to which you were called when you made the noble confession in the presence of many witnesses." The call of Timothy to keep his eyes on the prize is a necessary act of cheerleading, because, as the rich man in the gospel shows us, following the Law and the Prophets isn't always the obvious thing to do. Commonplace, outwards acts of faith are not the benchmark against which to measure our goals of faith. If we want to be competitive, in the realm of salvation, we are called to compete inwardly, with our hearts as well as our bodies.



Book Club meets every Friday in Crespi Hall at 1:30 pm


On September 16, book club began reading **The Jesuit Guide to (Almost) Everything** by **Reverend James Martin, SJ**.

The **Carmel Mission Bereavement Ministry** provides caring consolation and spiritual support to parish families who are grieving the death of a loved one.

The **Bible Study** holds weekly meetings to study and discuss various books of the Bible.

The **Book Club** holds weekly meetings to read and discuss selected books.

The **Carmel Mission Docent Ministry** provides historical stewardship for the Mission and its art and artifacts. The Docents provide a welcoming presence and historical information to our many visitors.

Eucharistic Adoration is a special devotion whereby worshipers dedicate their time to be present with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to honor, adore and pray to Him.

The Faith Formation Ministry provides religious education for the faithful of all ages.

The **Falge Farmworkers Program Ministry** procures and distributes food and clothing to farmworkers and their families, who are in need.

The **Homebound Eucharistic Ministry** practices the Corporal works of mercy. Members visit and comfort the sick and the elderly, and bring Communion to those who have difficulty attending Mass.

The **Women's & Men's I-HELP** (Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program) activities at Carmel Mission are one of the many Monterey Peninsula churches, faith communities, or service organizations that provide overnight accommodation, a nutritious hot meal, and a caring community to homeless men and women one evening a month.

The **Knights of Columbus** were founded in 1882 on the principles of charity, unity and fraternity. The Carmel Mission, Council 4593, Knights of Columbus, provides hospitality and fundraising support to our parish community.

The **Liturgical Ministry** supports all aspects of our parish liturgy.

The **Carmel Mission Basilica Schola Cantorum** is a traditional choral ensemble which assists with the music leadership every week at our 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. The repertoire of the group is drawn from the works of both contemporary and traditional Catholic composers.

Saint Francis of Assisi Patron Saint of Animals and Ecology



Saint Francis, perhaps the best-loved of all saints, was born in Assisi, Italy, in 1181. Young Francis enjoyed a life of luxury and fine clothes. One day, Jesus spoke to Francis from the crucifix in the little chapel of San Damiano: "Go, rebuild My house." Francis gave away his riches to the poor and lived for Jesus. He went about as a barefoot beggar, telling people that God loved each of them so much that He sent His only Son to die to save them. Francis also loved all of God's animals as his brothers and sisters. Others joined Francis in his care for the sick and lepers, and in 1224, Francis received from God the stigmata—the visible wounds of the Crucifixion. Francis died at Assisi in 1226, and two years later, was canonized a saint.






