FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

In the Gospel today we encounter a familiar character from the Advent season, John the Baptist. We begin Ordinary Time with his testimony in John's Gospel. In this account the evangelist does not himself describe the Baptism of the Lord, but rather shares John the Baptists' retelling of what he saw, heard, and did, and what that means about who Jesus is. John the Baptist was courageous in his witness, devoted to the work God called him to do, and always pointed, in his words and actions, towards Jesus. His final words in John's Gospel are "He must increase; I must decrease." (John 3:30) This humility did not prevent him from being an outspoken preacher, and indeed an outsized and eccentric character. Instead he used all of who he was to God's purpose. He embodied the statement we hear in the psalm today, "Here I am Lord, I come to do your will." (Psalm 40)

As we begin a new year, it is an excellent opportunity to consider what God's will is in our individual lives. It can be scary to consider surrendering to God's will for us - what if it clashes with what we want, or even more disconcerting, with what we feel we must do? It can feel that a large part of life is keeping ourselves and our loved ones afloat - physically, mentally, emotionally, financially. It is not so much what we want to do, but what we have to do, be it working constantly, neglecting our own health to care for our families, or neglecting our spiritual health to make sure we meet society's benchmarks.

The Sacred Scriptures, the history of salvation, and our personal relationship with our loving God all prove that God only wants what is best for His beloved children, for all of His creation. As we open ourselves to a new understanding of God's will in our lives, I invite you to join me in being equally open to the idea that this may challenge some of the ways we feel we must live, and that , if we trust Him, God can help us grow into happier, healthier doers of His will in this New Year.

Scripture Message

The focus of today's readings feels especially appropriate as we leave the festive time of Christmas but are not yet anticipating the even greater high point of Easter: we are called in all seasons, every single day to live what we are by the grace of God, a chosen people. In the Gospel we meet John the Baptist, who knew very well his place in salvation history. He sees Jesus coming and points him out as "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. Those listening to John, including those sent by the Pharisees as spies, (John 1:24) would be sensitive to the biblical and cultural significance of the symbol of the lamb, which recalled both the messianic Suffering Servant (Isaiah 53:7) and the Passover lamb (Exodus 12:1-13). The Gospel refers to "sin" as the collective brokenness and sinfulness of the world, not individual sins, and to the social and structural evil that will be arrayed against Jesus by his enemies. The evangelist John introduces us to John the Baptist in his prologue (John 1:6-9) because the vision of the prologue is what we hear John is sent to proclaim: Jesus as the pre-existing Word, the spirit-filled Son of God. John the Baptist's mission was always to point to Jesus, never to himself. The last words that the Baptist speaks in John's Gospel sum up his calling: "He must increase, I must decrease." (John 3:30) In Advent John the Baptists had a central role, as we move into Ordinary Time he reminds us that he is not the main character. He cedes the stage to Jesus who is beginning His active ministry. Let us join John in bearing witness to the One he encountered at the River Jordan, the One we encounter at the Eucharistic table.



Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

I want to take this opportunity to thank you for your support of our Annual Appeal to fund the work of our Falge Farmworker Ministry. Your financial support is vital to the continuing work of providing nutritious food, clothing, household essentials, personal hygiene goods, blankets and gifts to 158 families in need comprising approximately 600 people.





The **Carmel Mission Bereavement Ministry** provides caring consolation and spiritual support to parish families who are grieving the death of a loved one.

The **Bible Study** holds weekly meetings to study and discuss various books of the Bible.

The **Book Club** holds weekly meetings to read and discuss selected books.

The **Carmel Mission Docent Ministry** provides historical stewardship for the Mission and its art and artifacts. The Docents provide a welcoming presence and historical information to our many visitors.

Eucharistic Adoration is a special devotion whereby worshipers dedicate their time to be present with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to honor, adore and pray to Him.

The Faith Formation Ministry provides religious education for the faithful of all ages.

The **Falge Farmworkers Program Ministry** procures and distributes food and clothing to farmworkers and their families, who are in need.

The **Homebound Eucharistic Ministry** practices the Corporal works of mercy. Members visit and comfort the sick and the elderly, and bring Communion to those who have difficulty attending Mass.

The **Women's & Men's I-HELP** (Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program) activities at Carmel Mission are one of the many Monterey Peninsula churches, faith communities, or service organizations that provide overnight accommodation, a nutritious hot meal, and a caring community to homeless men and women one evening a month.

The **Knights of Columbus** were founded in 1882 on the principles of charity, unity and fraternity. The Carmel Mission, Council 4593, Knights of Columbus, provides hospitality and fundraising support to our parish community.

The **Liturgical Ministry** supports all aspects of our parish liturgy.

The **Carmel Mission Basilica Schola Cantorum** is a traditional choral ensemble which assists with the music leadership every week at our 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. The repertoire of the group is drawn from the works of both contemporary and traditional Catholic composers.

FINANCE COUNCIL REPORT

I speak for all members of the Finance Council when I state that this year's annual review of activities and finances makes us all more appreciative of our blessed parish and sacred grounds. Father Paul, our clergy and staff were confronted almost daily with new challenges and have met them all with grace and wisdom for the benefit of our parish.

Those of you who have been a part of the parish for some time know that Fr. Paul inherited significant financial difficulties which we have been contending with for years. Many difficult, yet prudent, decisions had to be made. We can now confidently report that, although we still must service a substantial debt, we are on a solid financial footing.

In a facility as historic as this one there are always unexpected expenses that must be addressed within the structure of our limited budget. This year a major flood in a building as well as the unexpected repair of the sprinkler system in Murphy Center were just two of the many "surprises" which needed immediate attention and were professionally handled by Fr. Paul and our staff.

The impact of the COVID pandemic is still affecting our parish activities. While restrictions have lessened, parishioners and potential visitors are still reluctant to attend indoor activities where people are in close quarters. Also, our historic buildings do not have modern ventilation systems which adds to concerns. These issues impact our facility from our store performance to the ability to offer sacraments such as weddings.

Fr. Paul and staff continue to respond to these concerns with operational changes which result in an enhanced and safer experience for everyone. Your contributions to our Safe and Sound AMA campaign have helped fund these important changes. The institution of a regular outdoor mass was welcomed by many parishioners and visitors. The ability to livestream the 9 a.m. mass has provided new access to hundreds and continues to be improved. The addition of outdoor visual museum displays enhances the visitor experience for those unable to enter confined spaces.

As you can see from the financial numbers in this report, all these efforts, together with your contributions, allowed Fr. Paul and staff to properly care for and maintain this sacred site.

As will be discussed in more detail below, we were able to meet our budgeted expenses although our annual donations dropped significantly. However, the staff managed to keep all expense levels under their control under budget. Operational expenses were over budget due to unexpected repairs.

Your finance council is well served by Maria Anderson, Patricia Gilbert, Paul Hoffman, Adam Tight, Richard Gorman, Grant Hunt, Frankt Fritsch, Tim Lewis, Justin Burke and Fr. Paul.

I will be leaving the finance council at the end of the year. It has been an honor to serve Fr. Paul and all of our parishioners over the last ten years. I will always hold this sacred Mission and its clergy and parishioners close to my heart.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Overall, we can report a healthy year as we ended with a small surplus over our budget. We are very grateful to Bishop Garcia and the Diocese for working with us to restructure our debt which enabled us to negotiate payments that fit into our annual budget. Without question, however, the greatest impact on our debt reduction has been the overwhelming generosity of our parishioners. We are forever grateful for your contributions toward keeping the Carmel Mission healthy and able to serve others.

Our current debt totals \$1,070,130 which is a 7% reduction from last year and a \$1M reduction since 2016. Our current projections indicate that it will take another 13 years to fully retire this debt.

On the revenue side, our plate collections equaled the collection amounts of the prior year. The amazing work of the staff to reopen the grounds for visitors and services led to dramatic increases in Income Services (weddings) which were up 40% and museum admissions which were up 30%. It is clear that without visitors and our special sacramental offerings we would have difficulty financing this facility.

On the expense side, Fr. Paul kept expenses below all budgeted amounts. Salaries and payroll expenses were more than 10% under budget. The only expense budget item materially over budget was Operation Expenses. That excess was caused by unexpected major expenses.


We ask that you prayerfully consider a gift toward the operational, maintenance and repair needs of our Mission parish. At present, 100% of the funds in our savings account are designated and restricted funds. With rising prices and costs, we have little reserve for operational and maintenance expenses which are necessary just to maintain our current operations.

The Mission does not use your contributions to specific ministries, designated projects or special appeals for general operational expenses. When you make a contribution to the Mission for a specific purpose know that all of those funds will be used only for that purpose.

The Mission would not be able to make that pledge or provide the opportunities for your designated gifts if our parishioners did not contribute funds for our operational costs.

Please consider increasing your weekly gifts to our plate collection. Some of you may also choose to make a donation specifically designated to help build up funds for operational needs. Every time we expand a ministry or services our operational costs increase. Additional funds would allow us to increase our opportunities for services and activities. If your desire is to help our community be more active, provide more services and grow, a contribution for general operational needs will have the greatest impact.

Periodic large donations from generous donors have greatly assisted our ability to support our operational expenses and expand our services



professors from Stanford and the University of California began to buy lots and build small cabins in the woods. The earthquake of 1906 brought refugees from San Francisco, many of them artists and writers, drawn by the beauty and affordable prices.

Enticed by enthusiastic reports of Carmel's charms and affordable lifestyle, a number of these free spirits moved to the village where they became known as the "Bohemians." George and Carrie Sterling formed the center of a loosely structured group of friends that included among its members Mary Austin, Jack London, James Hopper, Herbert Heron and Sinclair Lewis. The Bohemians often gathered at the beach for abalone feasts, fine conversation and libations.

Vigilant stewardship has preserved the incomparable natural setting of coastline and beach. Trees are a vital element of the village landscape and citizens hold dear Carmei's history and sense of community. Residents treasure their village. They have resisted change and worked to protect the legacy left by earlier citizens.



A LITTLE CARMEL HISTORY

By 1835, Carmel, like the other missions, was secularized and its extensive land holdings divided among several large ranchos, pieces of which ultimately formed Carmel-by-the-Sea. The mission buildings slowly fell to ruin and weren't fully restored until Harry Downie began a meticulous restoration in 1931.

The Carmel Development Company sent out its first brochure in May of 1903 addressed "To the School teachers of California and other




