Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

Jesus has a tall order for us disciples in today's Gospel. "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." (Luke 6:27) It is no surprise that this would be exquisitely difficult for us as it is not our nature, but God's. Only in God do we have the perfect example of love, generosity, forgiveness, and mercy. Jesus' teaching today reminds us that these are not abstract concepts, but concrete actions which require effort and intention on our part. Jesus invites us to emulate God in approaching one another as God does – giving freely without expecting anything in return.

Expending energy and time on people who do not care – or people who hate us – can feel impossible, fruitless, and frustrating. And yet, it is what God does all the time, what God has done for each one of us at one point or another. Jesus' command to "love one another" might not mean that we empty ourselves to the point of exhaustion. But it does mean that when we do pour ourselves out – whether we receive any recognition or payment in return or not – we can have confidence that we acted in love, and we acted for Christ. Our love – even if unnoticed – is not worthless. It is precious in God's eyes, as are we.

Turning back evil with kindness and mercy is a way to emulate our Creator, and to connect with the God who treats us with such loving kindness and care every day. It can also have additional consequence of changing the lives of those we encounter, even those who may hurt or revile us. Often hatred or ugly behavior comes from a place of fear, of self-loathing, of ignorance or pain. Perhaps people have forgotten, or never knew, that there is a God who loves them unconditionally, who is ready to heal them, comfort them, and forgive them. When we treat them as God does, with mercy and love at the forefront, we might be a bridge that brings them to healing and hope. Reacting to evil with evil only allows evil to flourish more freely. Meeting evil as God does, with compassion and understanding – while at times so difficult – has the power to change the world.

I wish you and your loved ones blessings of good health and great hope. Please continue to pray, and work, for peace,

Scripture Reflection

In the Gospel we find the Divine Giver, overflowing with an abundance of compassion, pardon and love. Among people who have struggled to have enough food to be given and overflowing measure of grain is an image of the creator's care and providence. The Gospel describes how we are to respond to the unearned gift of God's gracious mercy – by emulating the One whose child we are. Jesus spells out the ways that God's children do as God does: loving enemies, doing good to those who do hateful things, blessing those who speak abusively, and praying for such people. This manner of acting is not unique to Jesus. The first reading also gives an example of how not to return evil for evil. David chooses not to harm Saul, even though King Saul has been trying to kill David. Beyond individual actions of nonretaliation, Jesus invites His followers into a fundamental stance on life that must be chosen if we are to reflect the image of the One who made us. By continually opening ourselves to the immeasurable goodness, compassion, and love of the Most High, our meager capacities are stretched and expanded. The more we become conscience of how much we graciously receive, the more our measure for giving to others increases. Such a life stance demands relinquishing what is our more natural reaction; to want to return in kind what we receive. Measure for measure, and then some. - that is what we instinctively seek. Jesus points out that when evil is returned for evil, all it does is increase the evil in the world. Meting out goodness, compassion, pardon – especially when it is contrary to what is directed towards us – subdues and transforms evil. It ruptures the power of evil and redirects energies toward filling the world with gracious mercy.

2024 AMA PROJECT PLANNING UPDATE

FEBRUARY 2025 - UPDATE

We are happy to report on the good progress being made on the 2024 AMA campaign - The Blessed Sacrament Chapel: A Place of Prayer and Peace.

Our preliminary work has brought us to the budgeting and logistics phase of the BSC project.

Plans Received – Estimates Forthcoming

We have received a set of plans detailing building accessibility improvements and are working with a local contractor to get preliminary estimates on the proposed work.

Building Structure Restoration and Seismic Retrofit

Our BSC project necessitated us looking at the overall structure of the Blessed Sacrament Chapel building. It is most prudent at this time to explore the options to restore the entire building, which would include a seismic retrofit. This is a significant endeavor and we look forward to sharing the findings with you once the evaluation is complete.

DECEMBER 2024 – UPDATE

2024 AMA Campaign - The Blessed Sacrament Chapel: A Place of Prayer and Peace.

We recently received a generous contribution of \$20,000.00. Our AMA total to date is \$321,102.00 (including our \$70,000.00 donation to the Diocesan ministries). Though we promote our annual campaign fundraising in the early to late spring, we continue to receive donations until the end of the year. Our goal is to improve the ventilation, heating, and security of our beautiful Blessed Sacrament Chapel to make it more accessible, comfortable, and secure.

We have done much preliminary work to identify the necessary improvements to the Chapel. As the structure of the building itself needs restoration and seismic retrofit, we are in the process of understanding the parameters of such a project to ensure the work we do now is in line with that larger effort. We have already done much to improve the Chapel and Sacristy environments by addressing humidity, plumbing, lighting, storage, and plaster issues. We have engaged a landscape architect, contractor, and surveyor to develop options for improving building accessibility by providing better access for those with limited mobility.

We are still in the research phase of the project.

We must evaluate the structural recommendations and proposed improvements to clarify the project's scope, budget, and timeline.

We look forward to further work commencing in 2025.

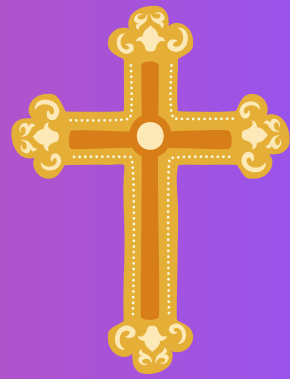

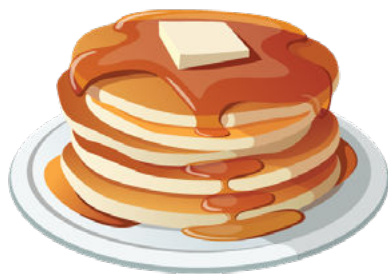

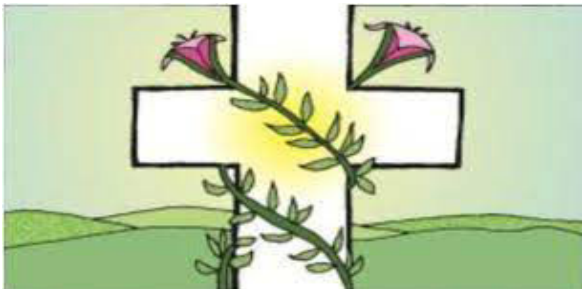
